# Kitchen Corner By Rita

Hearty Corn Pudding
4 eggs
½ c whipping cream
3 Tbl sugar
3 Tbl cornstarch
½ to 1 tsp vanilla ext
½ tsp salt
1/8 tsp cayenne pepper
1 (15 ¼ oz) can whole
kernel corn, drained
1 (14 ¾ oz) can creamed
style corn

4 strips bacon, cooked and crumbled

4 green onions, chopped ½ c shredded cheddar
Beat the eggs, cream, sugar, cornstarch, vanilla, salt and cayenne until smooth. Stir in both corns, bacon and onions. Pour into a greased 1½ qt casserole. Sprinkle with cheese. bake uncovered at 350° 35-40 mins or until a knife comes out clean.

Blueberries & Cream Cake 8 Twinkies 1 (8oz) cream cheese, softened 2 c confectioner's sugar 2 (8oz) containers cool whip 1 (21oz) can blueberry pie filling (or whatever flavor you like) Slice the Twinkies in half lengthwise. Place in a single layer in a 9 x 13 pan. Beat the cream cheese & sugar. Fold in 1 container cool whip, spread in pan. Spoon the pie filling over that and then top with 2nd container of cool whip. Chill & top with chopped nuts.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15.






Tech Session/meeting 3-9-08 10:00 (DST)

#### TIM'S NOTES

WOW! I am in "information overload" again this month. We had an excellent start on our engine project. It will, of course, be more work than originally planned. I plan on a tech session involving the differential redo (complete tear down, with new seals inside, check bearings etc). The trick is now ..do I wait to do it for a meeting, call a special evening session? (not good for me because I am used to retiring EARLY).. or maybe enough guys that care are available during the day during the week?

Meanwhile back in my shop, I am poking away at cleaning parts, thinking of what else we need to buy. The differential is clean and ready for tear down. The cylinder heads are cleaned up and back on. I ended up drilling the 61 heads to take later automatic choke units. See the pictures of that and the bad head under the right coast show blank The engine looks like an engine again. It now needs carbs, distributor, generator, starter, vacuum and fuel lines detailed and put on. We have a new crossover pipe for it now.

Several people have contributed lots of time on the dingy job of cleaning parts so far. We had one good extra day of hard work so far. Thanks go to Phil Domser sr and jr, Lenny Smith, Doug Dunlap, Kevin Fear for a full day of fun and dirt.

I hope someone will step up soon and make us some museum quality display boards to use with this unit.

The trailer is next. I have a frame here which I guess I no longer need, or we can get other options at reasonable costs. We will have to discuss this.

I hope this project generates enough interest to get you to a meeting and discuss our options. This display <u>should</u> end up like a rolling educational display of the Corvair powertrain. I have wanted to do something like this for many years.

On another **important** subject, CORSA has put out a questionnaire as a member survey. It was mentioned, that they would like it to get to non CORSA members also. The national organization is a VERY important part of our hobby, adding to the value of our cars, providing valuable information, and parts sources. The publication alone is worth more than it costs to belong. This club, along with others like ours, is feeling the pain of the economy. Please fill out the questionnaire, and get it to them asap. This CORSA board *seems* to want to go forward with things. We must do our part to help them see what most people want and expect from them.

And another subject to watch is the project Kevin has taken on!. It should capture a lot of attention when it gets going!. Ask him how he is doing on it, at the next meeting. It will be a dune buggy with Corvair power AND Corvair suspension on BOTH ends. The rear is the late model Corvair setup. Looks neat so far.

Any other neat stuff going on out there?

We all enjoyed the "Burma Shave story" dvd at our Borio's meeting. It was longer than I thought it would be, but seemed to keep our interest. I have some other neat dvd's that we bought at the car museum to show yet.



From exit 39 of the thruway; once off the exit go EAST on Rt 690 and keep to the right. Gct off at the Jones Rd exit and turn left on Jones Rd. Go .3 miles to a traffic light and go straight through this--- it will now change names to Brickyard Rd at this intersection. Continue straight 3 miles. This will be a "T" intersection at Warners Rd (Rt 173). Turn right and go 2.5 miles to next blinking light (this is Rt 31 and Rt 173). Go through this light and take a right kitty corner road named Elderberry. Turn right at the end of this and then the first left (within eyesight at the top of the knoll). This will be Daboll. You'll come to a stop sign at Kingdom Rd. Go straight and we're the 3<sup>rd</sup> house on the left (total of 1.1 miles on Daboll Rd).
