Kitchen Corner By Rita

This month Barb Robinson was kind enough to share a couple of her delicious recipes for baked beans and pineapple surprise.

Baked Beans 1 med or lrg can Grandma Brown's baked beans ¾ or 1 c brown sugar 1 pkg pre-cooked bacon

Put a layer of bacon on the bottom of casserole dish. Mix brown sugar and beans; if too thick add ¼ c water. Top with bacon stripes. Bake at 350 for 30 mins.

Pineapple Surprise 1 (13oz) can crushed pineapple, undrained 1 ¼ c 1% milk

- 1 pkg sugar free instant vanilla pudding
- 1 c fat free sour cream

Mix pineapple, milk, and sour cream. Mix in pudding. Top with sliced strawberries, blueberries or coconut, etc. Place in refrigerator.

Here's a couple more that sounded good for summer.

Burger Sauce 1/2 c mayonnaise ¼ c chili sauce 2 Tbl dill pickle relish

Mix all and use on burgers.

Bacon Spinach Salad 5 c spinach leaves 1 c fresh sliced mushrooms ½ c thinly sliced red onions 4 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled 2 hard cooked eggs, wedged ½ c low fat Catalina dressing

Mix spinach, mushrooms and onions. Sprinkle crumbled bacon and wedges of eggs on top. Drizzle dressing. The meeting was called to order at 7:01 by president Dave Robinson. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The treasurer's report was read and accepted.

See you at the next meeting (yup, more food!!)


