


From Len Smith:

Kitchen Corner By Rita Pineapple Ham Casserole

1 (20oz) can pineapple tidbits

½ c mayonnaise

1 tsp salt

1 tsp prepared mustard

½ tsp pepper

3 c cooked rice

2 c cubed cooked ham

1 c chopped green pepper

1 ½ c shredded Swiss cheese

1/3 c chopped onion

Drain Pineapple, reserving ½ c juice; Set aside. In lrg bowl combine mayo, salt, mustard, pepper and reserved juice; mix well. Fold in rice, ham, green pepper 1 c Swiss cheese, onion and pineapple. Transfer to a greased 2 qt baking dish. Cover and bake at 350 for 30 mins. Sprinkle with remaining cheese and bake an Additional 10 mins.

Angel Flake Coconut Cake

1 yellow cake mix

1 (7oz) pkg coconut, divided

1 c milk,

1 pkg vanilla instant pudding

1/4 c powdered sugar

1 (8oz) cool whip

Prepare cake as directed; stir in 2/3 c of the coconut. Pour into 2 (9 inch) round pans. Bake as directed. Cool . Mix milk, pudding & sugar. Stir in cool whip. Spread between layers. Sprinkle coconut. Frost cake, sprinkle The rest of coconut on top & sides.

TIM'S RAMBLIN'S

HI AGAIN

Well this month went by fast !!

WE MISSED THE EVENT AT Gloria and Kevin's due to rita's cold and my feeling iffy also.. but when it warmed up later on I went out to the shop and ran the truck a while to adjust the valves and fix a shorted spark plug (bad skip!) that was bugging me. It seems that the NGK plugs I use may be a little less tolerant to rich chokes (excessive gas) than I thought.. but it now runs much better..

Then last week I worked on a lot of misc stuff on the wagon and the truck. The wagon now has lights that work on all 4 corners! I rebuilt the headlight buckets and tail lights for it and the 64 coupe. I also finally came up with much better (brighter) tail lights for the rampy. I repainted the trunk on the coupe and am now getting ready to put it all back together. I installed a new emergency brake cable on it also. My latest mystery is why someone drilled a bunch of tiny holes in the front floor at random, then put small screws in them all. The floor has no rust, being from Texas. Oh well, I will remove them all and repair the holes. This car might be ready for the road this year with the engine that is in it, but I will have to check it out more yet. I know it needs a blower bearing, but they say it needs more. Sounds ok to me so far. The truck has been blind siding me a lot, so I just left it alone for now and worked on other things. This winter sure has not gone as well as I had planned!

Soon I will have to take time away from cars and do some overdue painting and other house maintenance work. I also need to finish up some long put off heavy duty antenna work for my ham radio stuff I did spend 3 days on the lawn mower, cleaning and painting the deck with POR15, servicing the hydraulic system, and changing the oil. Then I waxed it up good. I hope that's all set for a while now, I should have done that work last fall.

So far all I have to show for the winter's work is a bunch of unfinished cars.

A few of us are awaiting Ron's return north, so we can go "shopping" at his shop. He sure milks the most he can out of that Florida warmth. A side note, I found that SAVES in lakeland carries the POR15 super tough paints and thinners in stock. This stuff is the toughest paint I have found yet! It is the only paint I found tough enough to stay on that were in the water all season. So that means it is theee answer for undercar and suspension painting. It is not cheap, but it IS worth it. Also, wear rubber gloves when working with it, because it will not wash off with any thinners. I brushed it on my mower pan, and it looks bullet proof. Time will tell.

It sounds like the RECALL is shaping up nicely. I still need to finish up the trophies we started here yet.

I have peppered this issue with a few pictures of things I have been working on. Nobody supplied me with pictures from the last tech session!

Did everyone pay up their dues yet? We will be updating the mailing list soon. I hope you all belong to CORSA by now also. We need to drum up more PAYING members of CORSA. If you follow other similar clubs, you will find that membership in the national group is MANDITORY to belong to a local *CHAPTER*. yes I know we have discussed this before, with all the valid? Exceptions, but the others *have* to do it so.....with the economy as it now is, I still say don't go spending on unnecessary items. We all worked very hard for that club treasury over the years, so go forward *carefully*.




