Kitchen Corner

Sticky Bones

1 c white vinegar

½ c ketchup

½ c honey

2 Tbl Worcestershire

1 tsp each salt, dry mustard and paprika

1 clove garlic

¼ tsp pepper

4 lb beef short ribs

Combine all but the ribs in a saucepan.

Bring to a boil, remove from heat.

Reserve 1 cup. Marinate in the remaining

sauce and refrigerate at least 2 hrs. Bake at 325° for 1 hr., basting with the reserved sauce.

Apple Cheddar Bread

3 c flour

2 Tbl baking powder

¾ tsp salt

½ c sugar

1 ½ c milk

½ c veg oil

1 egg, beaten

1 egg yolk, beaten

1 small apple, cored, peeled and diced

1 c shredded cheddar

Mix everything except the apple and cheese.

Fold in the apple and cheese and pour into 2 greased and floured 8 x 4 loaf pans.

Bake at 350° for 40 – 45 mins.

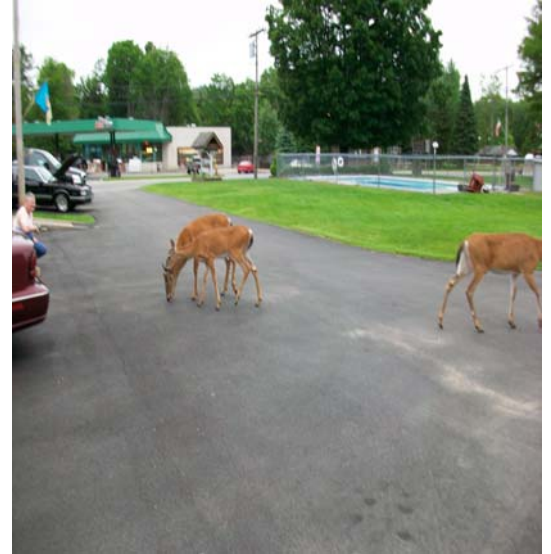

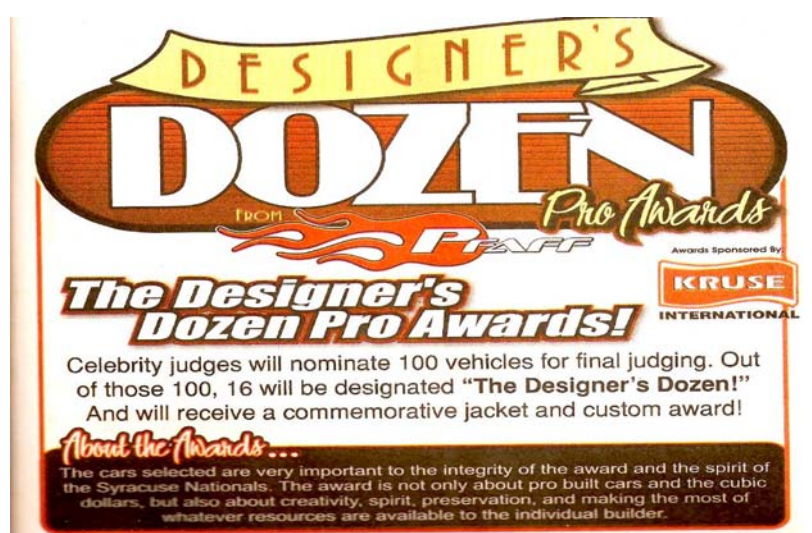
Syracuse Nationals
