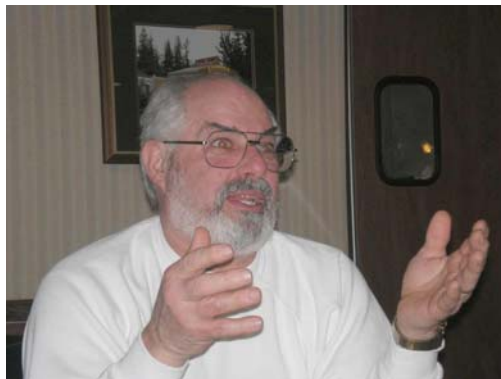
PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

On Sunday, August 15, several stalwart members of CNYCC took our air-cooled machines to the annual VW show in Brewerton. They graciously provide 2 classes for us, one for cars and one for trucks. When I arrived, I joined our portion of the show already in progress. Dave and Barb Robinson had their 66 Monza, Tim and Rita Colson had the 63 Rampside, Karen and George DeRousie had their 65 convertible (with the top up, since it was threatening to rain, and followed through later on), Lew Halstead had his 61 Lakewood towing his newest toy, a 61 Sea-King boat and outboard motor, and I brought my 64 Monza. The clouds drizzled on us off and on, so we alternated opening and closing our engine compartments, trunks, and windows. We were fairly dry under 2 tents and we would venture out to check out the cars when the rain subsided. Kitchen Corner

Vermont Maple Oatmeal Pie

1 single pie crust
4 eggs
1 c sugar
3 Tbl flour
1 tsp cinnamon
½ tsp salt
1 c quick cooking oats
¾ c corn syrup
½ c maple syrup
¼ c butter, melted
3 tsp vanilla extract
1 c coconut

Combine eggs, sugar, flour, cinnamon
And salt. Stir in the oats, syrups, butter
And vanilla; pour into crust. Sprinkle
with coconut. Bake at 350° for 50 – 60
mins or until set. Refrigerate leftovers.

Bean and Pork Chop Bake

4 boneless loin chops
1 Tbl veg oil
1 lrg apple, peeled and chopped
1 small onion, chopped
1 (28 oz) can baked beans
1/3 c raisins
¼ tsp cinnamon
1 Tbl maple syrup
¼ tsp salt

Brown pork chops and remove from
pan. Saute apple and onion. Stir in baked
beans, raisins, cinnamon and salt. Pour
into
2 ½ qt casserole. Top with chops. Bake,
covered, at 350° 40 mins. Uncover, brush
with
syrup and bake addl 10 mins.

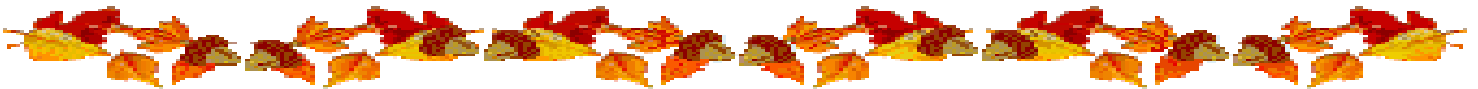

CNYCC PICNIC AND TECH SESSION

On Sunday, August 22, about 20 stalwart club members slogged through the pouring rain to the snug home and garage of Doug and Betsy Dunlap. Our activities were confined to the indoors, due to the soggy weather. The guys gathered in the garage to discuss "car stuff", while the ladies followed their own agenda in the house. Prez Nick volunteered (?) to man the grills to cook the steaks and sausage, while the ladies arranged the side dishes. After a delicious meal of meat, potatoes, vegetables, fruit, and desserts, the guys again hit the garage, where Tim conducted an impromptu session about carburetors, using several that Doug had on hand. Tim pointed out that, for the Rochester carbs, one size does not fit all. Even though they may look alike, there are subtle differences and running changes made throughout the years. Some of the orifices in the body were changed or added. The **adjustments** have to be tailored to the engine upon which the carbs are mounted. The modern so-called gas can cause problems, such as eating away the rubber tip on the inlet needle. Tim said that he solved a leaky carb problem by replacing a rubber-tipped needle with an old steel one from his used parts collection. He also recommended using the blue (marine) Sta-bil to treat each tank of gas to minimize problems. It seems as though these new gas formulations are causing trouble for old fuel systems. After a return to the house to polish off more goodies, we dashed to our vehicles and headed home. Thanks to Doug and Betsy for their hospitality.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

WOW! I am still in "information overload" **again** this month. Back again, with continuing sagas in my shop, and other "stuff".

So far this month, what little time I have had in my shop has been "injury free".

I am still working (slowly) on details for my latest motor creation. It will be a 4 carb motor. It has been run long enough as a 2 carb motor to get cam / lifters broken in, carbs, and distributor dialed in and check oil pressure and vacuum readings. It sounds great so far. Nice and quiet! I will explain the details of this very unique motor soon. It is not your average 4 carb motor. It should be perfect for my needs.

The motor in my truck now is running fairly well, now that I fixed the carburetor that had an early needle and seat in it. What a difference! But it still seems noisy in the center, like valve train noises or something weird. It has great oil pressure, so I am driving it as much as I can. (rain or shine). This motor will probably end up in the crampy someday.

We had a real nice time at the Port Byron show, Phil won again, then the VW show (in the rain), which I won a trophy at (because Phil was busy elsewhere). Our small group had fun in spite of the rain. There were a lot of nice cars there. There was a good mix of engineered stuff, buggy types and other very interesting vehicles. I have put a few pictures of some really clever work in a group on another page.

There was an electric "Thing", a VW powered motorcycle made from mostly VW parts, including brakes and wheels., a VW HUMMER, and a lot of other neat imaginative workmanship there. I love that type of stuff in cars, model airplanes, and radios. Clever personal work.

Our future (if our bodies allow it!) includes fall tours, and trips to VT and Massachusetts soon. A lot of things keep me from finishing many of my projects in the shop. Very frustrating!

The "tech session / picnic" at Doug and Betsy's was a resounding success, in spite of the heavy rain. I showed a few of my findings to do with Carburetors over the years, and we discussed headlights etc. Nick had fun flipping meat on the grill under the eaves. The girls were in the house doing their thing. (recipes, knitting, whatever)

Next tech session at my shop, I hope to do more with distributors and carburetors on the bench. I also have a plan to show how to rebuild a headlight bucket (early!)

This winter I will be building some more motors and differentials that I need. Phil will be getting a new "super motor" also. We are getting all parts needed together now.

If anyone is available on very short, and wants notification when we are doing certain types of work, let me know. It will be an interesting Time coming up. We will be removing the powertrain from a junk greenbrier soon, then separated parts to rebuild.

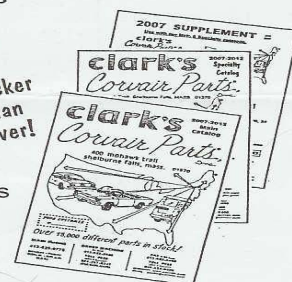

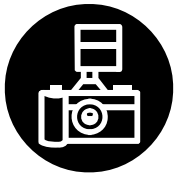
