

Kitchen Corner

Spaghetti Marvelo

1 lb grd beef
½ lb sausage
8 oz shredded mozzerella
8 oz shredded cheddar
1 jar spaghetti sauce
salt and pepper to taste
½ onion, chopped
fresh mushrooms, sliced
spaghetti, cooked and drained

Brown beef, sausage, mushrooms and onions; Drain. Combine meat mixture spaghetti, sauce, half of the mozzerella and cheddar and the salt and pepper. Pour into a 9 x 13 pan. Sprinkle the rest of the cheeses and bake at 350° For 25 mins.

Lemon Cake
1 lemon cake mix
½ c oil
4 eggs
1 1/3 c water
1 sml package lemon jello

Mix all together; pour into a 9×13 pan and bake at 350° for 30 mins. Frost as soon as it comes out of the oven.

Frosting:

1/4 c lemon juice mixed with conf sugar

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

GREETINGS, from the little shop in Memphis, NY.

This last month was sure a full one here. I am still working as often as possible in my shop. I spent a few days parting out a van from Georgia (courtesy of Phil) resulting in a few very nice parts for the rampy and crampy. Most people would not have put the effort needed to save these parts, but it was sure worth it to me. This is the one that yielded @ 5 gallons of water from the motor. It also gave me a rebuild able differential and transmission and many other goodies.

Phil sure had a winning season this year, with many prestigious awards. Dave McCarty's paint / body work sure paid off.

We had a wonderful time on our trip to Clark's / Baystate show. I took a slight detour to Bennington VT to Hemmings shop to get gas, and a few copies of the Hemmings Motor News magazine with the picture of Phil at the Stratton Mtn show. Then we took a ride up MT Greylock to take pictures of the scenery, and radio towers. We ran into a bonus, the ham radio club was there setting up several towers and antennas for the upcoming contest (last weekend). I took many neat pictures.

On the subject of "pictures", PLEASE start taking your camera with you to all shows etc you attend. I can not be at all of them, and a lot of them would be nice to share in newsletters. As most of you know, I have camera, will travel. I carry one in my pocket at all times. IF it would help, we might even have a tech session about cameras and working with pictures. I think MOST of you would enjoy your cameras even more if you had a little help along the way. I and others in the club have our methods of working with digital photos..

So please bring your cameras with you!!! Ask me for help anytime.

Latest tech tips: start with keeping a good gas treatment (stabil brand marine etc) in your gas. The new gas with higher alky content is causing problems, and also tends to collect moisture from the air and fail (stinks like varnish in short time!) sooner than the old stuff. Also do your research on today's oils when using them in our Corvairs. There is a lot of discussion on what is ok for our motors. Best way is to ask an EXPERT on motors. One way to get a lot of discussion on ANY Corvair related issues, is by joining the Virtual Vairs group, or Corvanatics. You may have to sort at times, but it is a good valuable resource.

Next, we are off to the VT tour, which WE have been doing since 1979 as a group, or Rita and I have been doing since 1969! I think we, along with Cotrofeld's are the only ones that have not missed a year yet. Someday we might even show up in a Corvair. On that note, I want to thank the Baystate club for allowing us to park a non Corvair on the property to help with our mobility limitations at the show, it helped a lot. I overdid it a little, but it was worth it!, Rita had a front row seat (while knitting) to most of the activities. A lot of our old acquaintances stopped by to say hello.

You should have seen Phil at the "candy store" of Corvair parts! I enjoyed the ability to take lots of pictures of the facilities. I hope to put together a show for sometime this winter of the setups there. I am sure you will be impressed. This is what helps keep our Corvairs going.

I guess summer is over, see you at Jordan, WITH CAMERA IN HAND


