Kitchen Corner

Sunday Baked Round Steak

2 lb round steak, 1" thick flour to dredge
1 large onion
1 green pepper
4 stalks celery
3 lrg carrots
1 (28 oz) can tomatoes
1/3 c catsup
1 (8oz) can tomato sauce
2 tsp horseradish
1 Tbl Worcestershire sauce
salt and pepper to taste

Dredge meat in flour and brown in fat in skillet. Place in a large, deep baking dish. Cut onion, pepper, celery and carrots into large pieces and add to steak. Mix remaining ingredients and pour over the steak. Bake, covered for 2 to 2 ¹/₂ at 325°

Baked Squash and Apples

11b butternut squash, cut in pieces
2 apples, sliced
1/2 c brown sugar
1/4 c cold butter
1 Tbl flour
1/4 tsp cinnamon
1/4 tsp nutmeg
Put squash and apples in a 7 x 11
baking dish. Combine remaining

ingredients till crumbly and put over squash. Cover and bake at 350° for 50 mins.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

GREETINGS AGAIN, from my little *shop in Memphis*, NY.

This time of year has always been tough on me, getting ready for winter etc. I had thought it would be a lot easier after our downsize and move, no more big boat to deal with, and no outdoor water supply issues BUT it is still a lot of hard work. It was a hard job for me just getting the mower deck cleaned up, painted, blades sharpened, serviced, and stored. Then I temporarily hung 2 replacement doors on the "crampside" (trashed the junk doors that came with it) and put it where the mower is usually stored for summer, to get it out of my way for winter. I cant wait to drive it around more, it is a strange thing to handle. It fits in such a small space. It is only 12ft long, bumper to bumper! Not too much longer than the lawn mower. All summer I have been stashing away some very exciting parts and ideas for the future construction of this "rat rod" project. I want to thank Ron for supplying a lot of neat stuff from the Buick Riv he junked out. Great supply of electronic toys to play with. The 64 greenbrier I am parting out, in spite of being the worst by far vehicle I have ever parted out (over 150!) has yielded me a lot of valuable (to me) parts. BUT it has been a very hard job so far. Things I have never seen rusted beyond use before, caught me by surprise. The gas tank fell out on the ride home (on a flat bed truck). I also found the motor hanging by the axles!, both forward motor mounts rusted out of the rear crossmember (a sponge like the front one). I hope to save all window and door actuators, because it was a deluxe with the upholstery in it (longer shafts for the handles). I found out the door glass fits my sandblast cabinet, so that's a savings of @\$25 each time I need glass change (often). I am now in love with that new huge parts washer I bought on sale at tractor supply , bigger than anything they sell at other such stores. Only problem now , is the cost of solvent. .and on that note , I just got the new price on replacing my large pot of Carb Cleaner... Talk about costing money to have fun..

Another side note, I am hearing several fire calls to do with small engines catching fire. They say the problems are related to the present junk gas. Be sure you are careful trying to get such stuff running, and away from buildings! I have helped a few out by soaking carbs and blowing the green junk out of them. I even had trouble getting my blower running, and it was (I thought!) properly stored!. It had the blue storex in it, but they say the blue startron or lucas product is better. Ask me about the old bad gas in Phil's loadside, it caused me GREAT grief! Now I will be changing the tank! Just be real careful working with this stuff, life is sure different these days.

Looks like my winter will be mostly the rampside, with finishing touches on Phil's Loadside worked in (along with my busy ham radio "responsibilities".) I have a huge wish list to get done this winter!. Most of the things I want to get done MUST somehow be done before recall. I also will try to work in a tech session sometime this winter, on valve cover racers, and maybe automotive electronics again. Electronics and carbs seem to be the most questions I get, so maybe I can dream up some way of showing you what it is all about quickly. I am also setting aside valve covers that are not really good enough for car use, but would be fine for racers. SO, do your homework, and save your ideas to use at a session. I will try to have a short section of track to play on. Also, I am going to rebuild my distributor machine, in hopes of building some for my project cars, and a few to resell. When you come here, you will see a few of my ongoing projects, such as 2 new motors, and some electronic upgrades for my Corvairs. THIS is the winter to really work on MY dreams that have been piling up for several years now!

Have you made plans to go to the nationals next year? Word has it, you waited almost too long to make reservations at the host hotel, but do your homework, because there are many other nice places to stay nearby. This area is a fabulous plase for summer explorations!. Check out all the web sites, and DON'T WAIT!! (he who hesitates....)
