
Shepherd's Pie

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

GREETINGS AGAIN, from my little <u>shop</u> in Memphis , NY.

_ This last months work in my shop included tracking down a few little stubborn bugs that showed up in the loadside project after installing the spyder dash panel. Somebody must have been going nuts trying to find problems in the signal lights. After replacing a missing bulb, I fixed bad sockets and a bad signal switch. Early signal light switches can be a challenge sometimes. First you must get things moving smoothly at the switch and the lever, then adjust the cable.

Next I started cleaning and rebuilding the carburetors that really got messed up by whatever sludge was in the gas tank. I replaced the tank with a "N O S" tank , that was also rusty inside from long time storage. This tank still had the part number on it , and had never been installed , but was in a barn for a long time. I did the clean out and sealer , then the POR15 coating on the outside. I also installed a new stainless sender from Clark's Corvair. They sure look nice! (I bought another one for my rampy). My next project for Phil's truck is rebuilding the gas heater and installing it. The price of the "burner service kit" is something that stops your heart. It comes in a very small package costing over \$100.00 , but I do not feel safe skipping that step.

I started working on components for my rampy at night. I am going thru the powerglide I saved from the 53,000 mile greenbrier, and the innards look new ,but the case was rotted beyond saving, and correct for a 164 cu inch FC (rare!). I also started on the new motor project. This motor has many upgrades to it. I am hoping the combination of cam, carbs, and other things will be optimum for a good all around travel vehicle.

Also, I am rebuilding another 3:27 differential to use with this setup. All in all, I am dreaming of completion for this spring. Plans are to put the whole setup that is in the rampside now into the "crampside". I am starting to panic about getting the truck done for summer travels!. Too many things keep cropping up to slow me down. I have a lot of responsibilities with Ham radio things now to add to the load.

As I work on things, I think about ideas for "show and tell" but best I can do to keep moving is take pictures. First thing that I think about when building carburetors, is all the subtle differences in the parts used, that affect the setup and running. I think a lot of things like this get missed when bulk rebuild outfits put them together. I made my own combination for secondary units from 61 and 65 carbs that should work well. Primary units are 65 up. If you want serious sticker shock, buy a pail of carburetor cleaner! I will HAVE to keep better track of what I use it for.

I hope to get a lot more done on shop projects before we have the meeting here. I have to move the truck out, get a chunk of track setup, and get a few things to work with on the bench. Lou is sandblasting and priming a few covers to use. Design of wheels etc will be a challenge we will have to deal with. I have some misc touch up paints here to use up, or you can bring your own.. (lots at real deals dollar store CHEAP)

I plan on having a short section of the old track here to try them on...may work , may not.

There are pictures of some of the things I mentioned throughout this issue.

I have not heard much about other projects going on...??? I have been talking with a guy who is building a neat kit car with a reversed Corvair motor on a VW transaxle. There is a picture of it running on the picture page.

I hear a few of our members have traveled south for a while.. (they have missed out on our "warm" winter)

This summer will be another very busy one for us here.

I am sure I will come up with other corvair things to show you at our meetings. Any subjects on your mind? Let me know.

Lou found an old issue (March / April 1986) Corvanantics, with a feature article on the "crampy" and a cover photo. I tried to scan it, but it will not come out good enough to share. If I find my copy, it may be in better shape to scan. The crampside will be an exciting project, IF I live long enough. I have so much to do first, it will be a long time yet. I have set aside a lot of the parts needed for it, but time is against me yet.

This is my folding table used mostly for first steps of assembling a motor. It has holes in it so the studs from either block half fit thru. This lets me put the crank and cam together without damage. After I get the halves bolted, I move it to the hydraulic table for final assembly and test running. I put new clean cardboard on it for each job. This has worked well for many years now. I also use this table for painting parts at times.





