Blackberry Cobbler

1/2 cup butter
2 cups self-rising flour
2 cups white sugar
2 cups milk
4 1/2 cups blackberries

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Once oven temperature is reached melt butter in a 9x13 inch baking pan.

In a medium bowl stir together the flour, sugar and milk; batter will be slightly lumpy. Pour mixture on top of melted butter in baking pan. Do not mix butter and mixture together.

Drop blackberries into batter; if more crust is desired add less blackberries. Bake in preheated oven for 45 minutes or until golden brown.

Cook Time: 45 minutes
Ready in 55 minutes
Servings 11

Kitchen Corner

Oven Baked Chicken

1 Tbl butter
2/3 c bisquick
1 ½ tsp paprika
1 tsp garlic salt
1 tsp Italian seasoning
¼ tsp pepper
1 cut up chicken

Melt butter in a 9 x 13 pan.
mix bisquick, paprika, garlic salt,
Itl seasoning, and pepper. Coat the
chicken and place skin side down
in pan. Bake at 425° for 25 mins;
turn chicken and bake an additional
15 mins.

Baked Squash and Apples

1 lb butternut squash, peeled and
cut in pieces
2 apples, sliced
½ c brown sugar
¼ c cold butter, cubed
1 Tbl flour
¼ tsp cinnamon
¼ tsp nutmeg

Put squash and apples in a 7 x 11
pan. Mix the remaining ingredients
until crumbly. Sprinkle over the
squash and apples. Cover and bake
at 350° for 50 mins.

Frosty Orange Crème Layered Dessert

2 c orange sherbet, softened
1 (8oz) pkg cream cheese, softened
1 (14oz) can condensed milk
1/2 c orange juice
1 (8oz) tub cool whip

Line a 9x5 loaf pan with foil. Spread sherbet onto
Bottom of prepared pan, Freeze 10 mins. Meanwhile
Beat cream cheese in large bowl until creamy. Add
Condensed milk and juice, beating until blended.
Stir in cool whip. Pour over sherbet in pan. Freeze
3 hours. To unmold, invert pan onto plate; remove foil.



GREETINGS FROM TIM's RAMBLIN's

This month we had a tech session at my dirty ole shop of Corvairs and Ham radio. The intent was to get a few more valve cover racers built. Lou was kind enough to sandblast and paint a few covers from my pile. We also had other "raw materials" available, and plenty of tools and bench space to work with. Well, most of us sat around and talked while Lou and others worked on projects...and played with the short section of track we set up for testing.

I had the "Crampy" out in the alley for people to look at. I am very anxious to get started on it, but it has to wait for the rest of the list. I showed my methods of changing idler and blower bearings, and a few new to me, tools. I showed the video inspection scope, and the LED trouble light conversion kit from Sears.

After we finished? Working, and had a very nice meal, I ran Phil's loadside (with those straight thru lakes pipes!) a short time, then the new motor on the test table. I held off running things because I did not want to "fume" us out...it was too cold to run the doors open. I am trying very hard to work on Phil's truck, and my own. The goal is to have things running correctly before Recall. I am building a new differential, and powerglide, along with that motor for the rampy. I also just picked up new bumpers for the rampy, and the old ones will go on the crampy. I just painted all of the brackets with POR 15 and they look good. There is so much to do, and so little time! I also have all the parts to redo the whole brake system on the rampside.

Our next tech session was supposed to be more valve cover racer work, and a couple of other subjects. I am not sure there is enough interest in the racers? I have other things going on, or if warned ahead of time can probably put on something about almost any corvair subject...so let me know by the next meeting. I try to be in my shop most days, working.

I hope a lot of you are planning on the nationals this year. It should be one of the best ever.

Recall plans are going well, and one change this year is valve cover racing will be indoors.

Recently, I received pictures and a note from Denny Randall about his repurchasing the blue V8 vaair. He plans on bringing it to the Recall. I included a nice picture of it below.

This summer, I plan on a cleanout of a lot of parts I know I will not need to finish my corvairs. IT will take time in warmer weather to get ready for this. So keep an eye out for more on this soon. There will be a lot of non corvair items also.

Also, while looking for something else on the web, I stumbled onto a picture of Tim Cotrofeld, of Arlington VT, with his V8 rat rod corvair...quite the project!. I posted the picture elsewhere in this issue.




Who: All CORSA members are welcome to participate, and the public is invited to see the Corvairs that will be on display throughout the event.
