Kitchen Corner

Skillet Cassoulet

1/4 lb smoked turkey kielbasa, cut into 1/2" slices
1/4 lb cooked ham, cubed
2 med carrots, sliced
1 celery rib, sliced
1/2 med red onion, sliced
2 tsp oil
2 cloves garlic, minced
1 (15oz) can cannelloni beans rinsed and drained
1 (14oz) can no salt diced tomatoes, Drained
3/4 tsp dried thyme
1/8 tsp pepper

Sauté kielbasa, ham, carrots, celery and onion in oil until sausage is browned and veggies are tender. Add garlic, cook 1 min longer. Stir in remaining ingredients. Simmer uncovered 4 to 5 mins or till heated through.

Coconut Cream Mini Cheesecakes

24 Nilla wafers
2 (8oz) pkgs cream cheese, softened
1/2 c + 3 Tbsp sugar, divided
2 eggs
1 Tbsp lemon zest
1 c sour cream
1/4 c coconut, toasted

Place 1 wafer in each of 24 paper lined muffin cups. Beat cream cheese and 1/2 c sugar till blended. Add eggs, 1 at a time beating till blended. Stir in zest. Spoon over wafers. Bake at 350° for 13 to 15 mins. Cool completely. Mix sour cream and remaining sugar. Spoon over cheesecakes. Sprinkle with coconut. Refrigerate.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

GREETINGS AGAIN, from my little *shop in Memphis*, NY.

<u>WHAT A MONTH!!</u> I now have the new motor for rampy running just about perfect . I ended up installing a used set of pistons /rods / cylinders from MY shelf. That fixed the bad noise problems. It turns out I have to check EVERYTHING when building a motor. Who would have thought that new top of the line pistons could be marked wrong at the factory? From now on I will only install parts that I get myself from vendors, NO third party stuff!

So I have a new, unused set of .040 full fin cylinders here extra, if anyone wants to buy them. I only compared measurements, nevr installed them. You can figure the price will be close to the catalog price. They are a very nice way to go. The pistons on forged high quality rods will be for sale also, they have @ 1 hour or so running time on them. If you are interested call me for details... I would take a new set of good pistons from Clark's with stock rods in trade (.040 !!!). Mine say .040, but measure .020. Anyhow this motor wore me out. Other projects going on , the gas heater rebuild details are coming along slowly as I fix al surprises that show up. I also got the 140hp running that will be installed in the 1960 project car, belonging to our newest members.

In other news, you sure missed a perfect tour last Sunday. We started out from the newly remodeled Arby's / Tim Horton's in Weedsport. Dave passed around progress photos of the convertible he decided to restore to HIS standards. This is the car he purchased from Paul Britton, one of the club founders.
