


Meet the Guilbault Family!

Kitchen Corner

Raspberry Brie

1 (8oz) round Brie ¼ c raspberry preserves 1 Tbl slivered almonds, toasted

Place brie in micro safe plate. Spread Prese4rves over the top and micro at 50% power for 2 mins. Or till warmed through. Remove and sprinkle with the almonds.

Cavatelli, Brocolli and Mushrooms

1 (8oz) pkg cavatelli, cooked and drained
1 head broccoli, cut into florets, cooked
½ c butter
3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
1 can sliced mushrooms, drained
¼ c parmesan cheese

Melt butter in skillet, Sauté garlic and mushrooms. Combine with pasta and broccoli and parmesan cheese. Transfer to a 2 qt baking dish. Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 20 mins.

Angel Lush Cupcakes

 1 (16oz) angel food cake mix
 1 pkg vanilla instant pudding
 2 (8oz) can crushed pineapple, in juice, undrained
 1 c cool whip
 15 strawberries, halved

Mix cake mix as directed and pour into 30 paper lines muffin cups. Bake at 375 for 12 - 15 mins. Cool. Mix dry pudding mix with undrained pineapple. Fold in cool whip. Frost cupcakes and decorate with strawberry half.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

GREETINGS AGAIN, from my little *shop in Memphis*, NY.

The continuing saga of the green Loadside:

After a little back breaking work, the clutch problem has been repaired. The truck surprised Phil, and myself by laying a 3ft patch with no effort, when I showed him how it is running last weekend. Not bad for a 3:27 differential, and not "horsing it" at all.

The headlights are rebuilt and reinstalled. You can see pictures of what I did to them below. These adjusting parts used to be very common items, even in my own parts, but I only had 2 sets left, and none locally!, So Clarks to the rescue again.

I have also started to work on the Lakewood nights. I replaced the transmission filler tube, and started installing the new padded dash. I am also getting ready to replace a leaky oil pan gasket. My plan is to get all under car work done, then put the "crampside in that spot for a long time. When I finish the "loadside" I will put the coupe in there for body repairs. The rampy is running good so far, so all I need now is replace the oil pan gasket, and then on with tinker stuff. I am out in the shop as much as I can with the heat, but most of the days I have to give up by noon or so and go inside to cool off. I enjoy Ham radio upstairs early in the morning, but it gets too hot by mid morning now. I guess I need to think about A/C someday.

We went to the Fairhaven car show, but by 10:30 it was a hard steady rain, so we finally left. It has to be hard on the gang putting a show on, then get that kind of weather. We always enjoy that show. They thought a few regulars may have held off to go to another show and barbeque in Conquest that afternoon. The local Fire dept, and the "Bayside Cruisers" work very hard to put on a good show.

A few of us are getting ready to head out to Sturbridge Mass for the 2012 CORSA nationals. I will come home with lots of pictures. I hope more of you take pictures at shows you go to and share them with the group via the website, or this newsletter.

Welcome to our latest members, Michael Guilbault and family from the Hamilton NY area, near Norwich NY.. He is working on a 64 project. (MY favorite year!). He is doing a lot of hard work to the body and powertrain.

Doug is replacing the crank balancer pulley on the 65 greenbrier, Phil is replacing several trim items on the blue rampside with new repro items from Clark's. I have not heard much from others, who must be too busy working on their vairs to talk much?

I have a very small "wish list" to take to the convention, In fact I am getting ready to sell off parts I know I will not need for my own work. One concern I have, Is those custom? Aftermarket? Greenbrier roll bars I have here. I hate to waste them, but I have no use for them, and they may end up getting cut up for other use. If you have ANY use for them, PLEASE let me know before winter! They are very nice bolt in for a Corvair FC. I also still have the set of risers for converting 2 carb heads to 4 carbs, including instructions and measurements to do the job. This conversion goes back to just before 140's came out, but has a few benefits that you do not get with 140 motors. It takes a little study of motor theory to understand. If you have the "How To Hotrod Corvairs" book, they explain it fairly well. This book, and Bob Helt's books are a must for anyone working on Corvairs. In fact, I consider my books a very important part of any HOBBY? I enjoy. (mine are mostly Corvairs, Ham radio, and sometimes, model indoor RC planes.) So remember, do not pass up bargain magazines and books at shows. Start with a Clark's catalog and add to it as you can. I also have kept a copy of Lon Walls around, and his PDF download on my computers. There are many other very good vendors out there to work with, and a CORSA national is a great place to meet and talk with them. WELL worth the cost of going just for learning "tricks of the trade/hobby" first hand, and sharing ideas. I enjoy adding "options" to my vehicles, and have shared many ideas which seem to show up on many cars before I get to it on my own. This is the main reason I am chomping to get to only my own cars for the next few years. I have accumulated most of the parts needed ,and the shop to work in , so now for the time.
