#### Kitchen Corner

Perfect Pork Chop Bake
6 (5oz) pork chops
½ tsp salt, divided
1 med onion, 3 potatoes, 6 med carrots,
all thinly sliced
1 tsp dried marjoram
3 Tbl flour, ¾ c milk, 1 can cream of
mushroom soup; mixed together
Brown chops, place in 9 x 13 ungreased
Sprinkle with salt. Layer onion, potatoes,
and carrots over chops. Sprinkle with
marjoram and remaining salt. Pour soup
mixture over veggies. Cover and bake at 350
for 1 hr; uncover and bake 15 mins longer.

Mushroom Oven Rice
1 c uncooked long grain rice
1/4 c butter, cubed
1/2 c each finely chopped celery & onion
1 c sliced fresh mushrooms
1 can chicken broth, 1/3 c water
1 Tbl soy sauce, 1 Tbl dried parsley
In large skillet, sauté rice in butter for
2 mins or till golden. Add celery and onion; and mushrooms; cook and stir till celery is tender. Transfer to 1 1/2 qt baking dish. Stir in broth, water, soy sauce and parsley. Cover and bake at 350 for 40 – 50 mins or till liquid is absorbed & rice is tender.

Caramel Apple Pie
1 double pie crust
1 c sugar, 1 ¼ c flour, 1 tsp cinnamon
5 c thinly sliced apples
½ c caramel apple dip
2 Tbl milk
½ c brown sugar
½ c cold butter

Line pie tin with 1 crust. Mix sugar, ¼ c flour and cinnamon. Add apples, toss to coat. Spoon into pie crust. Mix 2 Tbl caramel dip with Milk; drizzle over apples. Mix 1 c flour and brown Sugar. Cut in butter. Sprinkle over apples. Make Lattice top with 2<sup>nd</sup> crust. Bake at 375 for 50 – 60 Mins. Cool 10 mins. Drizzle remaining caramel Sauce over top.
