Kitchen Corner

Slow Cooker Turkey Breast 3 red potatoes, 8 carrots, 1 onion; all cut in 1 inch pieces 1 bone in whole turkey breast with gravy packet (5-6 lbs), thawed if frozen

Spray a 5-6 qt slow cooker, In cooker, mix potatoes, carrots, onions, and gravy from packet . Place turkey on top. Cook on low 7-8 hrs.

Fluffy Fruit Salad

- 1 (20oz) can pineapples chunks, drained
- 1 (16oz) can whole cranberry sauce
- 1 (11oz) can mandarin oranges, drained
- 1 (8oz) cool whip
- 1 tsp grated orange peel
- ½ c pecan halves, toasted

In a bowl combine Pineapple, cranberry sauce, and oranges. Fold in cool whip and orange peel. Garnish with pecans.

Frozen Pumpkin Mousse Pie

30 small gingersnap cookies

- 2 Tbl raisins
- 1 Tbl canola oil
- 1 c canned pumpkin puree
- 1/3 c packed brown sugar
- ½ tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp ginger
- 1/4 tsp grated nutmeg
- 2 pints frozen vanilla ice cream, softened

Coat a deep dish pie pan with cooking spray. For crust; combine gingersnaps and raisins in food processor and pulse until finely chopped. Add oil and pulse until blended. Press evenly into bottom and up sides of prepared pan. Bake crust about 10 mins at 350. Cool. For filling; combine pumpkin, sugar, cinnamon, ginger and nutmeg and mix well. Add ice cream and stir until blended. Spoon into cooled pie crust. Freeze at least 2 hrs. Let pie soften slightly in refrigerator for 20 – 30 mins before serving
