FROM BINGHAMTON:

Rt.17 to Exit 71 N (Airport Road). Go approximately 6 miles north on Airport Road. Turn left onto Commercial Drive. At end of Commercial Drive take right onto East Maine Road. Go 3 miles on East Maine Road to stop sign. Go straight onto a.m.es Road to stop sign. Turn right on Nanticoke Road- travel 7 miles. Turn left onto Greenwood Road.

FROM ENDICOTT:

Rt.26 North to Village of Maine. Pass elementary school on left, bear left at "Y" onto Nanticoke Road. Go 8 miles on Nanticoke Road. Turn left onto Greenwood Road.

FROM ITHACA:

Rt.79 East to Center Lisle. Pass white church on left, turn right onto Caldwell Hill Road. Go approximately 5 miles on Caldwell Hill Road. Turn right onto Greenwood Road.

FROM WHITNEY POINT:

Rt.11 North to Rt. 79 West. Go approximately 4-5 miles to Caldwell Hill Road. Turn left on Caldwell Hill Road. Go 4 miles on Caldwell Hill Road. Turn right onto Greenwood Road.

FROM OWEGO/NEWARK VALLEY:

Rt.38 North to Wilson Creek road (next to Newark Valley High School). Right on Wilson Creek Road. Approximately 5 miles to right tonetic Road. Stay on Ketchumville Road to end. Straight at stop sign to Greenwood Road.

Kitchen Corner

Calico Beans ¹/₂ lb ground beef 1 c onion, chopped 1 clove garlic, minced ¹/₂ lb bacon, cooked and crumbled 3 (16oz) cans baked beans in sauce 2 (16oz) cans kidney beans, drained 1 (15 1/2oz) can lima beans, drained $\frac{1}{2}$ c catsup ¹/₄ c brown sugar 1 tsp salt 1 tsp dry mustard 2 tsp vinegar Cook ground beef, onion and garlic till no longer pink. Combine with all remaining ingredients in 3 qt baking dish. Bake, covered, at 350 for 45 mins. Pineapple Zucchini Bread 2 c sugar 1 c veg oil 3 eggs 3 c flour 2 tsp baking soda 1 tsp salt ¹/₄ tsp baking powder $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsp cinnamon ³⁄₄ tsp grd nutmeg 2 c zucchini, shredded 1 (8oz) can crushed pineapple, drained 1 c raisins 1 c walnuts, chopped 2 tsp vanilla Beat sugar and oil until combined. Add eggs, one at a time till just blended. Combine flour, baking soda, salt, baking powder, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Gradually add to sugar mixture, till blended. Stir in zucchini, pineapple, raisins, walnuts and vanilla. Pour into 2 greased and floured 9 x 5 loaf pans. Bake at 350 for 1 hour. Makes 2 loaves. Red, White & Blueberry Pie 9" deep dish pie crust 1 qt strawberries, hulled and divided 4 (1oz) sqs white baking chocolate, melted 1 (8oz) pkg cream cheese, softened ³/₄ c cold milk 1 (3.3oz) inst white chocolate pudding mix 1¹/₂ c blueberries 1 c cool whip Bake crust at 425 for 10 mins; cool. Set 8 strawberries aside; slice remaining in half.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HI THERE, it sure is hard to believe another month has gone by already!

This summer has been mostly taken up by the latest Corvair project, a 65 CORSA convert, which started as a minor sounding situation, that quickly escalated into a complete new motor assembly, and now the repair of the differential. I think pinging took out the piston, spreading aluminum flakes thru the engine. The differential nose was probably broken by removing the motor without the transaxle assembly. It is almost impossible to remove the motor separately without breaking the throwout shaft. Clark's sells a heavy duty version, that holds 2 input shaft seals. The hardest part of these jobs is proper cleaning of the oily, grubby, parts. So, after transferring the dirt from the parts to me, I am now finally on the way back together. I am sure the owner is almost as anxious to see the end of this project as I am...

We have been driving the rampy around a lot, breaking in the new motor, and looking for any bugs. So far things look good after over a thousand miles. I hope to make a few more upgrades and checks as soon as I have room to work on it.

The next big project waiting, is a nice 64 convertible for Phil. It is mostly detail work, and a few minor? Upgrades. This car is in very good condition as it sits, but several details will be done in the engine room. This is the former Louie Lee car. I am focused on getting ready for long trips in the Rampy soon, then on with shop work. I am never done, and don't forget, I have ham radio things going on also!

Next show for us is Port Byron, VW show, then Wampsville, then Clark's in Mass, and Jordan, (We have a Vacation trip to VT in there also)

I am waiting for promised pictures from the CORSA nationals, and other shows from those lucky enough to have attended them...
