Kitchen Corner

Orange Crunch Yogurt

1/3 c granola cereal without raisins
1/3 c each coconut and chopped cashews
3 (8 oz) containers orange yogurt
1 (11 oz) mandarin oranges, well drained
Combine the granola, coconut and cashews.
In 4 parfait glasses layer half of a container of yogurt, 2 Tbl of the granola mixture, 5 or 6 orange segments, repeat layers. Serve immediately.

Brunch Pockets

1 (15oz) pkg refrigerated pie crust

2 pineapple slices, cut in half

4 slices each deli ham, turkey & Swiss cheese

1 egg, lightly beaten

Cut each pastry sheet into 4 wedges. Pat pineapple dry with paper towels. Top 4 pastry wedges with one slice each of the ham, turkey, cheese and pineapple folding meat and cheese to fit if necessary. Top each with $2^{\rm nd}$ pastry wedge; seal and crimp edges with a fork. Cut slits in pastry. Place on ungreased baking sheet. Brush lightly with egg. Bake at 350 for 25-30 mins or until golden. Serve warm.

Coconut Layer Cake

3 lrg eggs

1 (8oz) carton sour cream

3/4 c veg oil

3/4 c cream of coconut

½ tsp vanilla

1 white cake mix with pudding

Grease and flour 2, 8" cake pans.

Beat eggs, then add rest of the ingredients. Pour Into pans and bake at 325 for 25 mins. Cool

Coconut Cream Cheese Frosting

1 8oz pkg cream cheese, softened

½ c butter, softened

1 tsp vanilla

1 (16oz) pkg confectioners sugar, sifted

1 (7oz) can coconut, divided

Beat cream cheese and butter until creamy. Add vanilla; gradually add sugar, beat until Smooth. Stir in all but ½ c coconut. Spread Between layers and top and sides of cake. Sprinkle With reserved coconut. Store refrigerated.



TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HI THERE! Still working away in the shop most days. How depressing can it get, waking up to snow cover the 23rd of April?

At least we got to drive the Rampy over 300 miles on the new motor combination. It is amazing how much better it runs on the 110hp heads and .060 cylinders. Add a good 4 wheel alignment and 4 new tires and things are much better. The main reason it needed alignment was over the years it has had several motors with different rear mounts. The correct rear mount for a 64-65 FC is hard to get. I finally got correct ones with Phil's help. The rear mount affects the rear alignment, which causes severe rear tire wear. You can also feel the handing difference on the highway.

The white rampy is running good and is almost ready to go. It needs 4 tires and alignment to be ready. This project has been a long hard job.

I have the new 140hp motor in the loadside belonging to Phil. I need to finish details yet. So far, this job has gone smooth. The Lake pipes exhaust system added work to the job, but sounds nice. It now has small cartridge mufflers to cut the sharp bark noise down.

I am still also working on the 180 turbo motor project. I also am building a late 95HP FC motor to sell. The heads are fresh from the machine shop. The cylinders are .20 over with a factory 95HP cam. It should be a nice motor for a standard shift FC. From what I have read, this makes a good setup.

I am also cleaning out a lot of Corvair parts in my storage area. All my turbo parts are going, several sets of heads and blocks are going. I hope to take time to make a list soon.



My other hobby includes a regular schedule of sending pictures using computers and ham radios A lot of the pictures I send include Corvairs and Corvair events. 
