He was there all of 20 minutes and they told her to take him right now or they were going to kill him. They told her he was too uncontrollable. Well let's see – poor animal had just been rousted from the only place he's known for a year, been in a carrier for the entire morning, is all among strangers and they think he's going to stroll out of the carrier all warm and fuzzy? And then want to kill him? Well needless to say that wasn't going to happen so with much difficulty he was taken to a real rescuer. I got an update on him a few days later and he had already been neutered and given all his shots. Once he recovers and is acclimated to his surroundings he can be introduced into the rest of the cat population and hopefully worked with to be adopted. He, at least now, has friendly human company every day with fresh food and water and certainly a better environment than he has ever known. I certainly wish the poor little guy all the best.

Since I was tardy in getting my article to Tim last month, this is the next installment of my ongoing saga of car-related events in my area.

This year, we took an abbreviated trip to Springfest in Helen due to the fact that there were a lot of activities going on around us on the weekend of April 25th. Since Jody and Pam wanted to go with us, we decided to drive our "civilian" car, since the back seat is more comfortable than that of a Corvair. We arrived about 11 AM Friday morning and checked out the practice for the autocross. Jody and I then went over to the Festhalle area to check out the parts for sale. I ran into Phil and he took us to see his splendiforus Spyder. What a beautiful car - check out the photos. We didn't find any parts that demanded immediate purchase, so we walked back to join the ladies and have lunch. We went to a Mexican restaurant that we had dined at previously and had another great meal. We wandered back to check out the actual autocross and to watch the action. This course was much simpler than the ones that Lew devises, so there was very little drama and few "dead" cones. Everbody looked like they were having fun. We left shortly thereafter, since there no more activities scheduled for that day. On the way home, we stopped and browsed a few antique "shoppes". Lots of looking. but not much buying. Check the May issue of The Connecting Rod (Corvair Atlanta) for show results, including Phil's Gold Award.

Saturday the 25th was forecast to be rainy all day. However, after overnight rain, the day began mostly cloudy. Just before noon, I decided to take a chance on a show at Goodmark Chevrolet in Commerce. Russ had called to say that he and Leslie and friend Richard were going to be there, so I would have some cohorts to hang with. Richard (formerly Bullitt Richard, now Z-Man) had sold his Mustang and bought a 69 Z-28 Camaro. This was its first outing, so I was eager to see it. See photos on website. Because of the threatening weather, only about 45 vehicles entered the show. Despite this, there was a good variety of vehicles, including 3 early Camaros, a colorful 66 Lincoln Continental, a 409-powered hot rod, a mid-30s Buick street rod, a 36 Nash street rod, an ealy 50s Dodge pickup sporting an early Hemi and a matching trailer, and a mix of later model vehicles. Russ and Richard each won a Top Twenty plaque (actually their cars won) and the weather stayed dry, so it was a great day. Check out the photos.

Saturday, May 2, was the monthly cruise-in sponsored by the American Street Rodders. Attendance has been up since the club decided to draw for cash door prizes instead of merchandise. We also had a visit from about a dozen members of a Chevelle/El Camino club from Florida, which swelled our ranks of vehicles. The warm and sunny weather attracted about 50 cars, including a 51 Buick sedan with original straight 8 and Dynaflow, a restored 32 Chevy with its Stovebolt engine intact, assorted hot rods, a 60s Ford station wagon survivor, and a 61 Buick Lesabre with a modified Nailhead engine. We again had a good time and I won a \$20 door prize, so dinner was free and so are the pictures.

Saturday the ninth was a doubleheader. In the morning was the monthly swap meet at Atlanta Dragway. I drove my 65 turbo to put in the display area, where it was joined by about 30 other vehicles. I again hunted up the "breakfast bunch" and we cruised the aisles looking for bargains or must-haves. The sunny weather attracted over 200 vendors who offered both parts and cars for sale. Among the projects seeking new homes were a 40 Chevy sedan needing lots of work, a 41 Chevy sedan in better shape, a pair of early 50s Fords, Maverick and Mustang II race cars, an early 60s Chevy Impala ragtop, and a 62 Rambler American 2-door station wagon with original flathead 6. In the display area, I checked out a 51 Merc cool custom, a 53 Chevy mild custom, a restored 40 Ford Standard sedan, and , wonder of wonders, a 65 Corvair Sport Sedan. Along with Ben's beautiful 65 Corsa turbo (fresh from a Peoples Choice first place win in Helen) and my 65, there were THREE Corvairs there that day. An all-time high!! More pictures.

That evening, we ventured into downtown Maysville for the monthly cruise-in. The numbers were down, as only about 25 vehicles made the trip. Russ and Leslie and Richard were there again to suppoprt the cause, and Sher and I brought the Rambler and the Corsa. The new restaurant on the square (Cruise-in Cafe) is stiil struggling to get food prepared in a timely manner, but when it arrives, it is good. After dinner, we checked out the cars and sat in the shade and conversed. Ruby (Mustang John's wife) brought her new (to her) 2002 Mercedes roadster (it has a disappearing hard top) and it was joined by such others as a Pontiac Solstice, a 70s Trans-Am, some 60s Mustangs, a pair of 80s Malibu wagons, a couple of slammed S-10 pickups, and a 62 Impala 409. Sher's Rambler won a Top Ten plaque (because it's cute). A good time was had by all. Photos await your viewing.

Kitchen Corner

BLT Wedge Salad

½ c milk

3 Tbl lime juice

1 cup mayonnaise

1 shallot, finely chopped

1 Tbl ranch salad dressing mix

1 tsp pepper

1 garlic clove, minced

1 med head of iceberg lettuce

1 ½ c grape tomatoes, halved lengthwise

2/3 c crumbled cooked bacon

crumbled blue cheese, optional

Whisk milk and lime juice, let stand for 5 mins. Whisk in mayonnaise, shallot, dressing mix, pepper and garlic until blended. Cut lettuce into 4 wedges. Drizzle with dressing; top with tomatoes and bacon. Sprinkle with blue cheese if using.

Grilled Italian Meatball Burgers

1 egg, lightly beaten.

1/3 c seasoned bread crumbs

3 cloves garlic, minced

1 tsp each dried oregano &dried basil

1/4 tsp each salt and dried thyme

1 ½ lb ground beef

½ lb Italian turkey sausage, out of casings

3/4 c shredded mozzarella cheese

8 kaiser rolls

1 c garlic parmesan spaghetti sauce

Combine 1st 7 ingredients. Add beef and sausage and mix well. Max 8 burgers. Grill burgers, covered over med heat for 5-7 mins or till meat thermometer reads 165. Sprinkle burgers with cheese, cook 2-3 mins longer. Grill buns. Serve on rolls with spaghetti sauce.

Apple Cinnamon Shortcakes

2 c flour

2 Tbl plus 2 tsp sugar, divided

3 tsp baking powder

1 tsp cinnamon

½ tsp salt

1 c heavy cream

½ c plus 4 tsp melted butter

FILLING:

½ c butter, cubed

4 lrg apples, peeled and sliced

½ c brown sugar

½ tsp cinnamon

1/8 tsp nutmeg

Combine flour, 2 Tbl sugar, baking powder cinnamon and salt. In another bowl , combine cream and $\frac{1}{2}$ c butter. Stir into dry ingredients. Drop by $\frac{1}{4}$ cupfuls 2 "apart on greased baking sheet.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HI THERE! Still working away in the shop most days.

We observed Memorial day at a large car show at the birthplace of Memorial day, Waterloo NY. Needless to say, it is always a well attended show. Over 350 pre-registered, and at least that many more unregistered vehicles lined the streets of town in two rows on each side of Main St (Route 5&20). Gloria and Kevin were there also, with the blue 64 convertible.

I took 350 pictures there (and some came out!) of cars and tractors on display. There was a lot of "creativity" there in rat rods , and very nice cars , both restored original , and hot rods of all kinds.

I have made the decision to attempt to sell the unfinished Lakewood that has been waiting too long for final assembly. If I get what I am asking, it goes. You can get more deetails by calling or emailing me.

I also have a very good set of 140 heads, with rebuilt and run tested carbs with linkage and fuel lines for sale. This is a package of everything needed to make your late motor into a 140hp for FC, except air cleaners. Top shroud, side shrouds, and Clark's copper head gaskets are there also.

The white and red Rampy is now back home. The powertrain is all rebuilt and runs good. Phil's Loadside is almost ready , just lacking 4wheel alignment , before leaving. Then I get to work on his latest acquisition , a dark blue 64 Spyder Convertible. The winter projects here will probably include Phil's 8 door van motor etc , and my own 64 coupe. I also need to change the differential in my rampy (no biggie if my back was up to it), and add a few more options . The winter after next will be for getting the Crampy going. That will be a HUGE job.

So that is a small sample of what is happening here, working in very few shows, and Hamfests. That almost leaves time to mow the lawn once in a while.

My other hobby includes a regular schedule of sending pictures using computers and ham radios. A lot of the pictures I send include Corvairs and Corvair events.
