Kitchen Corner

Grilled Pork Tenderloin

- 2 (¾ lb) pork tenderloins
- ½ c dry sherry or orange juice
- ½ c soy sauce
- 2 Tbl brown sugar
- 1 tsp ground ginger
- 2 cloves garlic, minced

Place tenderloins in large shallow dish. Combine remaining ingredients; pour over tenderloins. Cover & marinate in refrigerator 8 hours. Preheat grill. Remove pork from marinade; cook in covered grill over med heat 20 mins or until meat reaches 160 degrees. Cut into slices.

Apple Stuffing

- 1 med apple, chopped
- ½ c chopped onion
- ¼ c celery
- 1 Tbl butter

1 (6oz) pkg stuffing mix
Saute apple, onion and celery in butter until tender. Prepare stuffing mix as directed on pkg. Stir in apple mixture.

State Fair Cream Puffs

- 1 c water
- ¼ c butter, softened
- ¼ tsp salt
- 1 c flour
- 4 eggs, room temp + 1 egg yolk
- 2 Tbl milk
- 2 c heavy cream
- 1/3 c confectioner sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 400. In medium saucepan Bring water, butter & salt to a boil over med Heat. Add flour and stir quickly until mixture Forms a ball. Remove from heat.

Add 1 egg and beat hard to blend. Add remaining whole eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition; each egg must be completely blended before the next egg. As you beat it, it will change from almost Curdled to a smooth appearance. When smooth Spoon 12 mounds onto a large baking sheet. In a small bowl, combine egg yolk and milk. Mix well and brush over dough. Bake 25 to 30 mins until golden. In large bowl, beat cream with electric beater until soft peaks form. Add confectioner's sugar & vanilla and beat until stiff peaks form. Split puffs, fill with cream; replace tops. Serve immediately, sprinkle with additional confectioner sugar.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

September 3rd, 2015

We have been very lucky this year , getting to the Corsa nationals in Knoxville , TN and the FALL CLASSIC at Clark's Corvair in Shelburne Falls Massachusetts. Next week we will travel to Arlington VT for our annual V.I.C.E. tour. After that , things will slow down , and I have to get things ready for winter. I have several projects to work on this year. I am building a new motor for the Rampside , and putting the present one in the Lakewood. The new motor will be a 110hp with .060 oversized Cylinders , and a Otto OT20 cam. The new motor is coming along nicely . This is if I do not change my plans again. I hope to get this all done soon , and have the Lakewood ready to drive by next June. Plus , I am building a new Turbo 180 motor for Phil. That will be a big project. I also have quite a "punch list" on another of his cars.
