Kitchen Corner

Hot Reuben Casserole with Creamy Beer Sauce

5 Tbl butter
2 Tbl flour
1 c lager beer
1 c milk
8 oz (about 2 ½ c) shredded Swiss
1 to 2 Tbl Dijon mustard or to taste
6 slices rye bread, cut into small cubes (about 4 cups)
¼ c Thousand Island dressing
¾ lb cooked corned beef, cut into bite sized pieces
½ lb sauerkraut, rinsed and drained

Preheat oven to 350.

Butter an 11 x 7 baking dish

Melt 2 Tbl butter in saucepan. Add flour, cook, stirring 3 mins. Add beer and milk; bring to a boil, stirring. Reduce heat and simmer, stirring occasionally, 5 mins. Remove from heat and whisk in 2 cups of the cheese, adding ½ cup at a time, until the cheese is melted and sauce is smooth. Stir in mustard to taste. Pat 2 cups of bread cubes onto bottom of baking dish. Drizzle with thousand island dressing. Arrange corned beef and sauerkraut in layers over bread; cover with half of the beer sauce. Toss remaining bread cubes with remaining butter in a bowl. Sprinkle cubes over top of casserole then pour the other half of the beer sauce over the cubes. Top with remaining shredded cheese and bake 25 to 30 mins or until heated through and lightly golden.

Irish Cream Chocolate Mousse

1 pkg chocolate instant pudding
 1 ¼ c cold milk
 ¼ c Irish cream liqueur
 2 c cool whip, divided
 ½ c fresh raspberries
 ½ oz semi sweet chocolate, shaved

Beat pudding, milk and liqueur in medium bowl with whisk for 2 mins. Stir in 1 ½ cups cool whip. Spoon into 6 dessert dishes, Refrigerate 20 mins. Top with remaining cool whip, berries and shaved chocolate

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN EVERYBODY !

Here I am again, yes, another crammed month. This last few weeks has been mostly on the white Lakewood Monza. It has been "fun?" working on some of my own junk for a change. I am still figuring out how I am going to clean the gummy oil residue from the inside bed area, and the motor on the Rampy. I am going to have to build a new framework and have a new canvass made. I also have to buy a new 10X10 tent to replace the oil soaked one. I am very lucky the tables and chairs for shows were not in there!

The white wagon project (called Daisy) is coming along slowly. All brake work is done, and the new Hands wheels with new Michelin tires are now on the car. I just finished the ugly job of installing the Spyder dash, after modifying the wiring to fit. Everything seems to be working. The motor sounds great. I just put a dual Exhaust with Crossover pipe on it. I made some quiet low restriction mufflers I had here fit. They are a touch long, but will work fine, and sound nice. I made tail pipes to come out to the side like a factory car single, but bigger diameter. Next hurdle is a good fitting hanger system. Putting this car back together is like building a car from ground up. I keep finding hidden projects. When I removed the factory defrost pipes to add a gas heater, I found why the passenger door did not close. There was only one loose incorrect bolt in the lower hinge (hidden by the defroster pipe), and loose rusty tools lost in the panels. Somebody must have given up on it. I had to mess around with hatch latch and readjust that also. I have lots of projects left to do, but most should? Not be too tough. They removed the inner seat belt mounts, so I have to make up new ones. Trunk floor needs a patch , then paint and rewire lights , horn , and wipers. I am trying to have it ready for June registration and Inspection. Now add to that the "Phil Project" for this year, plus a transmission reseal job , and other large projects waiting , and you can see that I am not bored. I also like to spend time with my Ham radio projects. I think we have a lot of fun things to do as a group this year, so I hope we have good participation. It will benefit all of us that choose to do so. Please try hard to join us at these events. It takes work to plan and debug any trips and shows we attend as a group, and most of the time all you have to do is show up and enjoy with us.

From the past, I have been hearing from the Zinteck's about getting the Yenko stinger back together. The memories of this project go back almost to the beginning of the club. The father , Ed , was one of the most inspiring guys in the C N Y C C founding group. He bought the boys that car "to keep them off the streets " and they admit that , along with scouting worked well. We look forward to more from them soon! Also , Bruce Marsden sent me a bunch of scanned picture memories from @1982 , some from our National Convention. What good times we had.







