Coffee Cake

2/3 c brown sugar

- 4 tsp cinnamon
- 1 pkg golden butter cake mix
- 4 eggs, beaten
- 2/3 c oil
- 1 c buttermilk
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> c sugar

Mix brown sugar & cinnamon together, set aside. Combine dry cake mix and remaining ingredients. Beat 3 to 4 mins. Pour half of batter in greased 9x13 pan; sprinkle with half the brown sugar mixture. Repeat layers; swirl through both layers with table knife. Bake at 325 for 40 mins or till set. Drizzle powdered sugar icing over cooled cake.

Icing:

1 to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  c confectioners sugar

1 to 2 Tbl milk, divided 1 tsp vanilla Beat together, adding the milk as necessary

Bourbon Baked Ham

(7 to 9 lb) fully cooked ham 1 1 c honey  $\frac{1}{2}$  c bourbon <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> c molasses <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> c orange juice 2 Tbl Dijon mustard Place ham in roasting rack. Scpre surface. Bake at

325 for 2 hours. In saucepan, combine remaining ingredients and cook & stir till smooth. Brush on ham and continue basting until ham reaches 140 degrees.

**Pineapple Casserole** 1 (20oz) can pineapple chunks <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> c sugar Tbl flour 3 1 c shredded cheese <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> c melted butter 1 c crushed Ritz crackers pineapple rings, maraschino cherries

Preheat to 350. Drain pineapple, reserving 3 Tbl juice. Combine sugar, flour & 3 Tbl reserved juice. Add cheese and pineapple. Mix well. Spoon into a 2 qt greased casserole dish. Combine butter and cracker crumbs & sprinkle over pineapple. Bake 30 mins or until crumbs are browned. Garnish with pineapple rings & cherries.

## HELLO AGAIN EVERYBODY !

Here I am again, yes, another crammed month. This last few weeks has been mostly on the white Lakewood Monza. It has been "fun?" working on some of my own junk for a change. The white wagon project (called Daisy) is coming along slowly. I am working on the last few things that require it to be up in the jack stands. When I finish that, I will move it out in the open , and move the convertible in . Then I can move things in and out of the shop again while working on the motor in the convertible. It is very hard to do this type of work , and keep things looking very detailed.

The Lakewood project keeps throwing surprises at me, reminding me that I have parted out better cars in the past. Broken off screws from the motor shroud retainers on the left side were the latest. I made the new inner seat belt retainer bolts. Working on installing the new carpets and interior parts is no fun without a pattern for the holes. I decided to paint a lot of the interior parts that were looking rough with black wrinkle. Beats buying new arm rest bases along with getting other parts plated. I hope it is a unique look. I have trouble remembering the focus of this car is driving it anywhere for fun, not making a "show car". See some of my progress pictures below

I am waiting for warmer weather to start on rampside. I have to make a new cover for it, including the frame. It was all ruined, along with our 10X10 tent when the waste oil I was hauling "got loose". About 5 of the 15 gallons went wild back there, covering the inside of the back of the truck. It even soaked the motor. I have driven it a few miles so far this season. The oil is finally burned off the mufflers.

Dan Burrows truck is at Yandows in Clark's Mills getting the body redone. It is looking good so far, of course more work than anticipated. We hope to see it at some of our events this year!

Speaking of events, I am looking forward to the Waterloo show on memorial day, the Fair Haven show on July 4th weekend, along with a few other shows. Maybe I can have something ready to attend. None of my cars are "show cars" any more, just concentrating on good running good and safe.

Someday, I look forward to cleaning the shop out, and starting over again. Remember I still have the 64 coupe with factory A/C and the Crampside waiting for finishing (a lot of work!)








This is an early example of a "rear engine" car at Hemmings Motor News Museum in Bennington VT. They always have @25 cars of interest on display. We always use them as a "pit stop" and fuel up on our annual trip to Vermont. Dave is giving it the eagle eye. The car is a 1886 Benz Motorwagen by Karl Benz of Manheim Germany. It is a horizontal watercooled motor putting out a whoping .7 (seven tenths) HP on naptha (white gas).







These are the 140HP heads That I have for sale. They were redone and installed on a motor in the Rampy. Then I built the latest hopped up 110. I want \$500 for them including copper gaskets , and studs. They are in excellent shape. The rest of the stuff , 4 Carbs (all rebuilt and run tested) linkage , fuel lines , and early side shrouds (no exhaust manifolds) \$300. The secondary carbs have idle circuits .I ran this setup for most of a season with no problems . I was never happy with any air cleaner setup on a truck or wagon , the ones I made up were not good looking , and restrictive. The 4 bonnets were not a very good filter , just window screen. We drive the truck a lot , so I was concerned about extra abrasive dirt getting in my beautiful full fin cylinders. They really should go in a car with a stock air cleaner. Questions?
