












ACTIVITIES

Kitchen Corner

We have a real treat for you this month! Pete & Pam have agreed to share their delicious dessert recipe for their Éclair Cake and Lee & Corrine are sharing their recipe for their Creamsicle Salad. Believe me --- it doesn't get any better than this!

Éclair Cake

1 c water

1 stick margarine

1 c flour

4 eggs

Boil water and add the margarine and melt. Add flour and beat with fork; then cool slightly. Add the 4 eggs one at a time and beat after each egg. Put in a 10x15 greased pan. Bake 30 mins at 400° until golden brown, then cool.

Filling;

1 lrg instant vanilla pudding 3 c milk 8oz cream cheese, softened

large container cool whip

Hershey syrup

Prepare pudding as directed on package with 3 c milk. Once set add softened cream cheese. Beat thoroughly and pour over cake. Let stand 15 mins. Top with large container cool whip and drizzle Hershey syrup.

Creamsicle Salad

3 c water

1 (3oz) pkg cook & serve vanilla pudding

1 (3oz) pkg cook & serve tapioca pudding

1 (3oz) pkg orange jello

1 (8oz) cool whip

1 (11oz) can mandarin oranges

Bring water to a boil and add pudding, tapioca and jello; stirring and bring back to a boil. Remove from heat & cool thoroughly. After cooling put in bowl & add mandarin oranges and cool whip. Refrigerate to chill thoroughly.

TIP; 1) if using metal uncoated pan use A wooden spoon, not metal spoon.

- 2) Refrigerate for about 24 hrs before serving
- 3) do not use instant pudding
- 4) don't do more than double ingredients per pan.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN

Another exciting! month at the "little corvair shop in Memphis NY"

In a word, exasperating. The first episode was getting the 62 Lakewood Monza registered. Got Insurance cards, but it was 3 more weeks before I had time to go to Fulton DMV. First trip, they sent me away needing more signatures on more forms, and to get a certified weight slip.. So I took care of all that (took a week to chase down signer of forms and get car towed to scales) Trip 2 got me another long wait in line to find out they wanted yet another impossible to get form signed. Trip 3 I was so aggravated, I now know why people go nuts and the woman that took care of me looked at it again and said oh no!, to which I told her I had been there 3 times, and followed instructions each time, and the whole process was very unfair, because they did not give me the right info the first time. So she finally put it thru and gave plates. Ok, next story of same "fun?" was when the new owner of the red Lakewood I sold said he had a week off and wanted to get plates. Well, nice guy me (darn good thing!) volunteered to go with him figuring a shoe in because many years ago I had all the papers "preapproved" at that office. Of course they found an impossible to get problem. Well a little magic never hurt any body, so after waving the wand 2 times, he went back and came home with plates.

After all of that , I drove our Lakewood about 15 mile in 90 plus temperatures , came home with it a little noisy at idle , and test oil gauge reading very low. Rev it just a little , and pressure was fine. Well that messed my mind because that motor is all new super stuff. So I took it all apart , and checked bearing clearances. They were of course , perfect. Next step was taking the oil pump apart to check. It looked ok , except a few (not many) fine lines on the edge of one of the gears. I replaced the gears , checked clearances to cover , housing looked like new , put it together , and drove the heck out of it for over 10 miles around the neighborhood. Backed it in the shop , checked oil pressure , and it looks fine now. I am now finishing details on the inside , made a new Delco CD radio fit the pod , and installed my ham radio. Now I am wiring it all up. I took the dash out because the speedo needs calibrating , (I check with a GPS), and the head light switch failed. I converted to a late model head light switch , which is a better design.

The rampy is getting a new cover soon. There are heavy duty custom bows being made to fit the new Oak (as in expensive!) frame. That will make the truck more useable, and look better without that ugly deck box back there.

My next "Phil project" arrived on a trailer yesterday. I get to repair pulled threads in the right Cylinder head. Of course they are the harder ones to do, but I have a special longer tool here for that problem ...somewhere.

We went to the Wednesday night cruise in at DB's in Weedsport when the model T regional tour was in town. What a nice bunch of cars and people! They were from all over the USA and Canada. They spent almost a week here , taking various @100 mile tours every day, using Auburn area hotels as a base , and Bass Pro parking for the trailers. We spent the night sitting with the truck and @70 other cars. They had a fifty -fifty drawing , and other prizes. There was a nice band playing most of the night. We really enjoyed the evening there , and if I was not tied up with weekly Ham radio broadcast duties , we would be there every week.

Our next car show is August 6th, at Port Byron. That is a busy day with the car show., Skaneateles Antique Boat show, and a ham radio show in Trumansburg That I used to like to attend. We will do the car show again this year. It is one of our favorite shows. Next will be VW show August 14th. We need to try to get to the Port Byron show EARLY and together somehow so we park together because they do not save spots or group cars. . SEE YOU THERE!

Thank you Dave and Marge for the pictures they brought back from the nationals. Congratulations to Phil who survived the convention with no phone or camera with him!, but did very good with the Blue Spyder convert, being put in senior class now
