I didn't finish them in time for the annual American Street Rodders show on September 24 in Hoschton.


The cooler weather finally arrived on September 28, just in time for activities on October 1. This month's swap meet was a 2-day affair (Friday and Saturday) in conjunction with the fall Cruisin' Commerce on Saturday evening. It was also the date of the last cruise-in of the season for our car club and the weekend of the Maysville Autumn Leaf Festival. Lots to do. I began with the swap meet in the morning, along with the "breakfast bunch". Since a race was being held at the track, the swap meet was held on the grass outside the track. I cruised over in my truck, as I hadn't read of any provisions for display cars. I found some of the rest of the "bunch" wandering the aisles, so we hooked up and looked for ways to spend our money. We checked out the various vendors and cars for sale, such as a "needy" 57 Chevy Bel-Air, a rusty 65 Comet (even the roof), a 64 Plymouth racer, and a Monza (not a "real one") race car. The few display cars included a nice 57 Chevy Bel-Air, a 56 Ford two-door wagon, a vibrant yellow Road Runner, a 70s custom Chevy truck, and a 49 Willys Jeepster with a Chevy V-8 engine and upgrades. Look at the pictures. No real "can't live without" bargains (especially Corvair items), so I went home with money in my pocket.

After I got home, Sher and I went to the Maysville Autumn Leaf Festival to check out the arts and crafts booths and to have some lunch. Lots of creative people showing their wares and some good-smelling food. We walked, ate, and then returned home to await our evening activity. That activity was the Cruisin' Commerce car show held in downtown Commerce, about 8 miles away. During the afternoon, I took the Corsa for a little drive and it quit after about 5 miles. I guess that it wasn't as "repaired" as I had thought. I coasted onto a side road and tried to restart it, resorting to spraying carb cleaner into the carb. It ran until the cleaner burned, then quit. I deduced a fuel problem. A young couple enjoying their shady porch helped me to push the car into their driveway. A few tests pinpointed a dead fuel pump. The young couple offered me help and some water to drink. I thanked them and then proceeded to my repair. Being a long-time Corvair owner (or being paranoid), I carry spare parts and tools. I swapped in my spare fuel pump and in about 20 minutes I was back on the road. I thanked the young couple for their moral support and returned home to clean up, to put another spare fuel pump in the trunk "just in case", and to prepare to drive to Commerce for the show.

We arrived a little early to secure a parking place, driving the Rambler, which is easier for Sher to get in and out of. Russ and Leslie were already there with their 66 GTO convertible. A couple of the other members of the "bunch" showed up with their wives (no cars ready), and "Z-Man" Richard showed up later with wife Linda in his 69 Camaro. There were about 70 or 80 cars on display, so after grabbing a bite to eat (another 50/50 restaurant), we strolled among the cars while I snapped a few pictures. I especially enjoyed a neat 40 Ford Standard coupe street rod, a rat rod ready for Halloween, a 36 Ford with flathead power, a pink(!) early Falcon convertible, and a sweet 56 Chevy convertible. Pictures of course. We stayed until a little after dark and then wended our way home to walk the dog. I checked out the Corsa the next day and it's running well (I hope).

Kitchen Corner

Broiled Cheese Rounds
1 lb bacon, cooked crisply & crumbled
1 lb shredded sharp cheddar
1 onion, minced
1 to 2 Tbl mayonnaise
2 loaves sliced party rye

Combine bacon, cheese & onion; blend in mayonnaise. Spread onto bread slices; place on an ungreased baking sheet. Broil 3 to 4 inches from heat for 3 mins.

Thanksgiving Meatballs 6 oz pkg turkey stuffing mix 1 lb ground turkey 1 egg, beaten salt and pepper to taste

Prepare stuffing mix to package directions; let cool. Combine turkey, egg, and stuffing; season with salt & pepper. Form into 2" meatballs. Place in an ungreased baking pan. Bake uncovered, at 350° for 12 to 15 mins, turning after 7 mins. To serve dip in Cranberry Spice Sauce or toss to coat.

Cranberry Spice Sauce

1 c water 1 c brown sugar 1 (12oz) pkg fresh cranberries zest of ½ orange ¼ c orange juice ½ tsp allspice ½ tsp cinnamon

In saucepan over med-high heat. Bring water and brown sugar to a boil. Add remaining ingredients; reduce heat to low. Simmer until cranberries just start to pop and gently fall apart. Cover and chill slightly before serving.

Pecan Pie

1 (9 inch) prepared unbaked pie crust
1 c dark brown sugar
1 c light corn syrup
3 eggs, slightly beaten
½ c butter, melted
1/3 tsp salt
1 tsp vanilla
1 heaping cup pecan halves

Combine all ingredients, except pecans & crust. pour into pie crust and sprinkle with pecans. Bake at 400° for 15 mins. Reduce heat to 350° and bake for 35 mins longer until center is set.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN

Another exciting! month at the "little Corvair shop in Memphis NY"

Boy, I felt guilty having so much fun last month. We had a very nice time on the Clayton boat tour! The weather was good, and our tour guide was very knowledgeable about all things Thousand Island related. This year, they had the glass bottom opened up for viewing unusual things under water. We floated over some interesting objects under us. The box lunch was tasty as well. It made up for the cool overcast ride we had last year. We sure look forward to doing it again next year.

Another event we look forward to every year is our annual VT tour. We had good weather for all of our tours, some rain, but at night. This was our 37th year with this group, BUT *our* 47th year doing trips this time of year that included VT.

Out in the shop, I have been working on several interesting projects, including some on my own vehicles. I have installed new shocks on the front of the Lakewood which helped the wild handling a lot, but it still needs work on front control arm bushings and rear springs with shocks. The car runs down the road pretty good considering what I started with. It is a fun car to drive around. I hope to use it for some of the local shows next year. I just installed the gas heater last week, and it is in working order, but needs a little more work on a binding flap that controls the heat. I set it aside for now because other work is waiting.

I purchased 4 motors from Ron's collection to rebuild when I get time. One was a mix of parts that must have started as a 1960 motor , "adapted?" to fit a late model car. So I guess I will try to find a "caveman" person who needs a 1960 motor. Another is a 64 95hp which will get rebuilt. The other one is tough to decide what to do. It looks like a brand new ? 63 FC motor. We think he bought it as surplus at a school shop auction many years ago. So I guess I will take it apart and check it out , then get it running as it sits , instead of putting all new late model guts in it. The fourth one was a rough early 84Hp . I took it all apart , donated the block to a machine shop to make an adapter for his boring machine. SO we will have an expert machine shop right here in town available to bore our cylinders . He has done quite a bit of work for me for the last 2 years . I still use Clark's full fin Cylinders with his good pistons on most of my jobs. It ends up being a lot of work to "do it right". By the time you get done cleaning all the parts , repainting shrouds and assembling the motors it ends up costing a lot to do it right. I rebuild the carbs , distributors , and other parts of the motor. There are pictures of the motors on the www.cnycorvair.com web site. I suppose this season is about over , so I will be changing the oil and putting the vehicles away soon.

I will be rebuilding a gas heater in Phil's green convertible this week. It needs the dreaded "service kit", a very expensive small parts kit for the burner assembly. The worst part of it is getting the heater out of the car and putting it back after repairs. I will take pictures of this job.

I hope you all had good times this summer at the events we attended. I hope to free up more evening time next year, so we can attend more cruise ins.

I want to remind every one that a newsletter is an important part of a club, and in our case is REQUIRED in order to maintain our chapter status with CORSA. 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
