Kitchen Corner

Crumb Crusted Pork Roast with Root Vegetables

1 (2 to 3 lb) pork loin roast

4 tsp honey

1 Tbl molasses

1 ½ tsp spicy brown mustard

2 tsp sage

1 tsp dried thyme

1 tsp dried rosemary

½ c soft whole wheat bread crumbs

2 Tbl grated parmesan cheese

1 rutabaga, peeled and cubed

1 sweet potato, peeled and cubed

1 celery root, peeled and cubed

1 onion, cut in wedges

2 Tbl canola oil

½ tsp salt

1/4 tsp pepper

Place roast on rack in shallow baking pan, sprayed with cooking spray. Mix together honey, molasses and mustard and brush over roast. Mix together sage, thyme and rosemary; set aside. Toss Bread crumbs with parm cheese and 2 tsp of the herb mixture; press onto roast. Add veggies, oil, salt & pepper to remaining herb mixture and arrange around roast. Roast 1 to 1 ½ hr or till reaches 145 °. Remove roast from pan and let sit 10 min before slicing.

Peppermint Bark Cheesecake

18 Oreos, finely crushed (about 1½ cups)

3 Tbl butter, melted

30 starlight mints, divided

4 (8oz ea) pkgs cream cheese

1 c sugar

4 eggs

1 pkg (4 oz) white chocolate, melted

1/4 tsp peppermint extract

1 pkg (4oz) semi sweet chocolate, divided

2 c Cool Whip

Preheat oven to 350°

Mix cookie crumbs & butter and press onto bottom of 9" springform pan. Bake 10 mins. Meanwhile crush 25 mints. Beat cream cheese and sugar in large bowl until blended. Add eggs 1 at a time mixing after each addition. Add white chocolate, crushed peppermints and extract; mix until just blended. Chop half of the semi sweet chocolate and stir into batter. Pour over crust.

Bake 55 mins to 1 hr or until center is almost set. Run knife around rim of pan to loosen cake; cool before removing rim. Refrigerate 4 hrs.

Meanwhile chop remaining mints and chop remaining chocolate. Spread cheesecake with 1 cup cool whip in dollops around edge of cheesecake. Spribkle remaining mints and chocolate over center of cheesecake.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

First, I am sure we all enjoyed our "welcome to winter" For a while there we wondered if it would ever stop blowing and snowing. I included a few pictures of what happened here on page 2

Out in the shop I have started on a large project punch list on a very interesting car, a rare Glen Pray Cord 810 replica. This car was made in Oklahoma back in 1967. There were @ 97/ made. This one is a 140HP 4 spd. Corvair powertrain in the front. This car serial number indicates it was originally a 180HP turbo car. It came here from near Chicago III. It is in very nice shape, showing a little over 10,000 miles. It is a touch different to work on, and I have to remove the motor to do some of the work. First step was to remove the front Torsion bars. With the help of a former partner and expert suspension guy, we have torsion bars off it (it was not that bad to do after all). I have all the carbs apart and cleaned. I am redesigning the secondary carburetors like I did on Phil's 4 carb Loadside, which runs great. The wiring harness is burned badly in several places, so I have to replace it, or rebuild it. I got the one listed in Clark's catalog as original, but not sure yet if I will be able to use it. Cosmetically, it very dirty from bad storage. Looks like I have a long fun winter ahead. I am putting the Cord aside for a few days to finish work on some motors I have in process. I also hope to finish a few details on the Lakewood this winter. My gas heater install went OK, but one flap door works too hard, and bent the cable. So now I will take it out and repair it somehow. The car seems to run good, but needs the back springs and shocks, along with a bunch of rubber bushings replaced. At least the car looks much better now.

Mark Fausak is nearing the final stages of cleaning out Ron's shop . It is supposed to ready for sale the first of December , which is looming fast!. The gold 61 4 dr that Ron was working on is up for grabs CHEAP . It runs good , has new brake parts and other things redone m but needs the whole front floor replaced. IF you want it , better get with Mark , it is too good to part out , but will need interior work . Outside looks good . IF I get it , I will part it out to save the good stuff from the crusher. But I have a space problem , and moving it in salt will not help, Plus it will cost me for towing. all glass and doors look good, and powerglide and motor are way better than most 61's you see. I told myself a lie the last time I parted out a Corvair here , that it would be the last one.. I just find it hard to see them go to a crusher , when a lot of good parts are there. Even some of the correct hardware is getting expensive to buy. I try to clean , sort , and save all hardware from the cars I part out. Yes , I am running out of room here fast.

It is hard to believe another year has gone by already. Next year is another Baystate Corvair show at Clark's year. We try to attend them now. They are every other year at Clark's Corvair location in Shelburne Falls Mass. It is always a fun packed weekend. The year after that we hope to attend the Nationals in Pittsburg PA.


