1 onion, chopped ¹/₂ c butter, cubed **1** garlic clove, minced $\frac{1}{2}$ c flour 1 tsp salt 2 c chicken broth $1 \frac{1}{2}$ c milk 4 c (16 oz) shredded mozzerella, divided 1 c grated parmesan, divided 1 tsp dried basil 1 tsp dried oregano $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp white pepper 2 c ricotta **1** Tbl minced parsley 9 lasagna noodles, cooked & drained

- 2 (10oz) pkgs frozen spinach, thawed & drained well
- 2 c cooked cubed chicken

Saute onion in butter, Add garlic & cook 1 more minute. Stir in flour & salt until blended; cook until bubbly. Gradually stir in broth and milk. Bring to a boil; cook and stir till thickened. Stir in 2 cups mozzerella, ¹/₂ c parmesan, basil, oregano & pepper. Set aside. Combine ricotta, parsley and remaining mozzerella. Set aside. Spread ¹/₄ of the sauce into a greased 9x13 pan. Layer 1/3 of noodles then ¹/₂ of the ricotta, ¹/₂ of the spinach & half of the chicken. Cover with ¹/₄ of the cheese & 1/3 of the noodles. Repeat the layers of ricotta, spinach and chicken

avers of ricotta, spinach and chicken & $\frac{1}{4}$ cheese sauce. Cover with remaining noodles & cheese sauce. Sprinkle with remaining parmesan. Bake at 350° uncovered for 35 – 40 mins. Let stand 15 mins.

HELLO AGAIN from the little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

I am having a lot of "fun?" in the shop. Still acquiring parts and information for the Cord project. There is very little documentation to go with these cars, and modifications were made as they were built, so each one is Slightly different. The 2 most daunting projects ahead are the design of a good shifter, and replacing the melted wiring harness. I have seen 3 different designs of powerglide shifters so far. It has been fun reading some of the quirks of this car. I am almost ready to drop the power train out of it and really get to work. I have to finish Phil's motors first, and get them out of my way (3 motors!). @ are done, number 3 is coming along good for what I had to work with. It should be running soon.

The weather was so warm the other day, I started looking at the gold 61 4 door I am parting out. I decided against getting the motor running, so it will become parts. I have someone interested in the rear part of the body to make a couch. I need to jack it up and start removing axles, motor etc, and wire harness. I think there are all new brake parts on it also. Ron was working on it to make a driver, so there are a lot of good parts on it.

I also have a few motors for "cores" to look at rebuilding. One is almost brand new early FC motor .This motor was a school shop unit sold at auction many years ago. I plan on getting it running to sell. I have to provide missing parts , but main motor is basically brand new. Another one is a Corsa 140 block , I replaced a year or 2 ago because it broke a piston and spit metal chunks all thru the motor. I decided to take it apart for the Crank , which is the nitrided one used on 140 and turbo motors. I will get it checked , but it looks very good so far. BUT the cam had one lobe worn perfectly round. I washed the block and crank out , no grindings are there now. Thinking back to when I first looked at this , I could have put a piston in it and tried to get it running , not knowing about the "skip" that had to be there a long time! Things like this make me even more careful estimating motor work. My only method is "not sure how much , or how long it will take" if that works , fine. It is far too easy on things that old to give accurate estimates without spending serious money up front (at a high risk) to see what is needed. This goes for old cars , and old anything (electronics especially).

My other hobby also keeps me busy most evenings. I do quite a bit with local ham radio services. Any questions about that wonderful hobby, go to www.upstateham.com for more. If you have any interest in Amateur radio, there are clubs in town to visit for help, or contact me for suggestions. We have a several licensed hams in our club. This could be very handy keeping people together on some of our tours IF they equipped their cars with a rig, like our cars have. It might be nice also to get more people equipped with CB radios when we travel as a group. It is a huge help sometimes with our other club groups. It can be frustrating on a tour getting separated by traffic, stop and turns, or a car quitting.

think ahead to the upcoming show events for 2017. There are several very good times ahead., including our own "Recall 2017" thanks to Dave and all working hard to keep it alive and fun. We are still working on a selection process and help at the recall. I will attempt to keep you aware of upcoming shows. If you know of any shows, please alert me asap.
