GEORGIA ROVING by Len Smith



Kitchen Corner

Chicken Spaghetti Casserole with Mushrooms

1 lb spaghetti, cooked and drained
1 ½ to 2 c chopped cooked chicken
¼ c each chopped red and green peppers
½ c chopped onion
½ tsp salt
1/8 tsp pepper
1 (8oz) sliced fresh mushrooms
1 can cream of chicken mushroom soup
½ c chicken broth

Saute red & green peppers, onions and mushrooms. Add the rest of the ingredients; mix. Place in greased casserole. Cover and bake at 350° for 45 mins.

Apple Carrot Slaw

½ c sweetened dried cranberries
 ½ c orange juice, divided
 2 granny smith apples, cored and cut into matchsticks
 ¼ c red onion, thinly sliced
 ½ c pumpkin roasted pumpkin seeds
 ¼ c chopped pecans
 Tbl olive oil pepper to taste

Combine cranberries and ¼ c orange juice in small bowl; set aside. In separate bowl, toss apples with remaining orange juice; add carrots, onion, pumpkin seeds and pecans. Drain cranberries, reserving juice; add cranberries to apple mixture. Whisk reserved orange juice with olive oil; pour over salad. Season with pepper; toss to coat well. Serve chilled or at room temperature.

Coconut Layer Cake

3 large eggs
1 (8oz) carton sour cream
3/4 c veg oil
3/4 c cream of coconut
1/2 tsp vanilla extract
1 pkg white cake mix with pudding coconut cream cheese frosting

Preheat oven to 325°. Grease & flour 3 8inch cake pans. Set aside. Beat eggs. Add sour cream and next three ingredients, beating well after each addition. Add cake mix, beat until blended. Pour into pans. Bake at 325° for 25 to 27 mins or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool in pans 10 mins; remove from pans and let cook completely on wire racks. Spread frosting between layers and on top & sides of cake. Sprinkle with coconut.

Coconut Cream Frosting
1 (80z) pkg cream cheese, softened
½ c butter, softened
1 tsp vanilla extract
1 (160z) pkg powdered sugar, sifted
1 (70z) pkg coconut, divided

Beat cream cheese and butter until creamy; add vanilla, beating well. Gradually add sugar beating until smooth. Stir in all but $\frac{1}{2}$ of coconut.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

I am having a lot of "fun?" in the shop The further I get into this year, the more "conflicts" I run into in upcoming months. One weekend in September has 3 choices, and I like all of them. It will be a tough call on at lease 3 of the weekends. So it will be another "exciting" year here.

I have been getting updates from the body shop that is doing the White and Red Rampside belonging to Judy and Dan Burrows. It is coming along nicely, and as I predicted, it has been lots more work than planned. It has been changed to the colors that the body number plate indicates. By visiting that shop, I learned more about modern body repair methods and materials.

This winter has been rather tough at times, so I am running behind. The "Cord project" is a real time soaker, and not having any shop manual to work with, slows some of the work down. The wire harness comes coiled up in a box with no connector housings, just bare terminals and plugs. Sorting it out, and getting it in the correct place, and hooking up all the gauges and switches will not be easy. Getting the old 4 speed shifter removed was not easy either. Then I have to design a dash sub panel sturdy enough to support a powerglide shifter yet. This car will be really interesting to drive when we get done with it.

On my own vehicles, I have a lot to do as soon as I can make room in the front part of my shop. I ended up having to store a lot of extra things this winter, which cramped my plans a lot. It will not happen again.

There are going to be a lot of nice shows coming up, so soon I will be trying to get all the information together so we can plan events. We know Fairhaven is the 4th of July weekend, and Waterloo is the Memorial day (28th) weekend. We also know that Rita and I will not be here for Jordan Fall Festival this year. It is the weekend of the Baystate Clark's Corvair show. It would be too wild of a ride to make it home in time to participate there. I think at least 3 couples from here will be at Clarks. So some one else will have to get to Jordan EARLY to hold that super spot. Even when we get there at @8AM, there are people eying that area. The same goes for most shows now, they do not "save spots". Only one that does is the VW show.

We are trying to fit in a couple of very nice group tours this year also. So be ready for more fun times with our cars. I would like to see more people getting CB's OR, if a Ham, bring a radio, so trips will go smoother. After all of our years traveling all over VT keeping a LOT of cars together, I miss that type of organization here. It takes very little practice to maintain a proper distance between cars at all times, especially when in areas we have to deal with Stops and turns. It is important to try to keep together, and a good eye on the car BEHIND you. We also try to park all the Corvairs together whenever we stop, so picture taking can happen. We try to group them in front of the building or sign of that stop. Makes nice pictures for newsletters etc. I hope we have another successful Recall to continue the legacy started by our founders We hope to see you all at our next meeting. 




