"CORVAIR FUN FACTS"



- Motor Trend magazine named Chevy Corvair "Car of the Year" in 1960.
- Corvair is the 1st and only mass-produced American vehicle offering an air-cooled rear engine design, unibody construction, factory turbo-charging, and 4-wheel independent suspension.
- The 1962 Corvair Spyder, along with the 1962 Oldsmobile F-85 Jetfire, was America's 1st vehicle to offer factory turbo-charging.
- 1965 Car & Driver magazine called Corvair "undoubtedly the sexiest-looking American car of the new crop and possibly one of the most handsome cars in the world."
- Almost 2 million Corvairs were made during their 1960-69 run, including 2- & 4-door models, convertibles, station wagons, pick-ups, and passenger vans.
- The 9-passenger Corvair Greenbrier van, produced from 1961 thru early 1965, is considered by many auto historians to be the forerunner of the modern minivan.
- Contrary to popular belief and the infamous stories involving Ralph Nader, Corvair is the only car ever certified "Safe" by the United States government.
- The August, 2007 Hemmings Classic Car Magazine called the Chevy Corvair "GM's Mechanical Marvel...Pure and simple, these are still great cars...And extremely advanced for their time."
- Already enjoying steady appreciation, the Corvair is still considered "one of the world's least expensive collector cars".

Kitchen Corner

Teriyaki Grilled Chicken Thighs

8 large chicken thighs ½ c soy sauce 5 green onions, chopped ½ c lime juice 2 Tbl dark brown sugar 1 Tbl honey

1 tsp dried crushed red pepper

1 clove garlic, pressed

Place chicken in 7 x 11 baking dish. Combine soy sauce & next 6 ingredients; pour over chicken. Cover and refrigerate 8 hours. Preheat grill. Drain chicken, reserving marinade. Bring reserved marinade to a boil in small saucepan. Set aside for basting. Cook chicken over medium heat 10 mins each side or until done, basting with reserved marinade.

Calico Beans

2 lbs ground beef, browned and drained 1 lb bacon, crisply cooked and crumbled

1 onion, chopped

3 (15oz) cans pork and beans

2 (16oz) cans kidney beans

2 (16 oz) cans baby butter beans

1 (16oz) can navy beans

1 c catsup

½ c brown sugar

2 Tbl prepared horseradish

2 Tbl Worcestershire sauce

Add all to crockpot; do not drain beans. Stir well. Cover and cook on low 6 hours. Stir again before serving

Key Lime Coconut Angel Cake

1 angel food cake, cut into three layers 1 (14oz) condensed milk

1/3 c ley lime juice

1 Tsp grated lime peel

1 (12oz) cool whip

1 c coconut

Beat together condensed milk, lime juice and lime peel. Fold in cool whip and spread 1 cup between each layer. Sprinkle coconut on top of each layer. Frost with remaining cool whip and coconut.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

Hello again. Things in the shop are sort of scary right now. Besides the very intense Cord project , I have an interesting situation going on. I have the pickup back in my shop that had such traumatic damage that I had to build a new motor , differential , and transmission for a couple years ago. Well it has been in a body shop ever since. Now it had the touqe converter come loose twice , making horrible noises. This time I put another converter , and drive plate in it, figuring they were the only 2 parts that were not replaced before. Well after replacing the parts I went to start it. It had really old stinky gas (not much at all) in it , so I drained all @2 gallons out , put 5 of new in it. Still no run , has great spark , gas getting there etc. It did sound like it had a super battery in it , turning over so easy for a motor with only @150 miles on it. Next step was to check cam / crank timing . I have read that it happens , but on Corvairs , it is a very rare failure. Well that is the problem. I am tearing it down to change the crank and check everything . The crank key is a long way from where it belongs. The only good thing so far , is it did not touch valves to pistons. I still call this truck evil!.

I now have the club display trailer here for storage. So far I have only replaced the parts we stole from it to repair Ray's "Buffy", and put a decent quality automatic battery maintainer on it. It starts and runs good, but has oil leaks and needs re detailing. My plan for it now are to build a whole new setup from parts acquired from Ron Fausak's shop. I am going to add a storage box on the front of the trailer. The only thing I need help with, after I get my part done, is a design idea for a lightweight, easy to work with, cover for it. If you have any ideas to work with, please contact me. No rush, I am very busy here, and that includes neglecting my own vehicles. Speaking of My vehicles, only 3 now (all need work of some kind) after deciding to sell the Crampside to some one that WILL put it together. I will help him with the motor and wiring project, but he will do all the rest. He is very good at this type of project.

Well Louie and Clara joined us in the rain at the Fairhaven show. Only about 20 cars were dedicated enough to come and support the Bayside Cruiser group. It was a sad scene, but we had a good time talking with those that were there, and enjoyed some delicious food from the trailer. We look forward to a better day there next year!

It was nice to see that a few of our group could make the trek to the CORSA nationals this year. Sounds like they had a good time. We are planning on the Pittsburg trip next year, if all goes well. We have been to a bunch of them over the years, but it gets harder all the time to do things like this.

Our next really nice time will be at the Baystate Corvairs show at Clark's Corvair in Shelburne Falls Massachusetts. If you have never been there, I highly recommend it! It is a real nice time, with a very capable group putting it on.

Our next fun group gathering will be the Sims store Erie canal dinner boat. I am sure you will enjoy it. It is very good food, and informational. We get to hear facts about the Canal in our area, and see the hard work they have done to restore interesting parts of it. This is at the exact midpoint of the original Erie Canal, at Sim's store in Camillus NY. 




