Kitchen Corner

Apple Pecan Spinach Salad

3 Tbl olive oil
2 Tbl balsamic vinegar
1 tsp Dijon mustard
1 tsp pepper
½ tsp salt
1 (5oz) bag fresh baby spinach
1 (5oz) bag fresh arugula
2 Honeycrisp apples, halved, cored & thinly sliced
¾ c toasted pecans
½ c crumbled blue cheese
Whisk together the olive oil and next 4 ingredients
wrti well combined. Tage cently with genera. Top

until well combined. Toss gently with greens. Top with apple, pecans and blue cheese.

Baked Scallops

1 lb fresh sea scallops
 ½ c milk
 1 egg, beaten
 1 c Ritz crackers, crushed
 ½ c butter, melted
 2 cloves garlic, minced
 1 tsp dried dill weed

Cut large scallops in half, if desired; place in heat proof bowl. Add enough oiling water to cover and let sit for 3 minutes. Drain; pat dry with paper towels. Dip scallops in milk, then egg, then crushed crackers. Place in greased scallop baking shells or individual baking dishes. Combine butter and garlic; spoon over scallops. Sprinkle dill and remaining crackers over scallops. Bake at 350° for 15 mins.

Sunny Lemon Pie

- 1 (4oz) pkg cook & serve lemon pudding mix, cooked as directed on package
- 2 Tbl lemon juice
- 1 ¹/₂ tsp grated lemon rind
- 1 c sour cream
- 1 (9") graham pie crust
- 2 c Cool Whip

While pie filling is still hot, stir in lemon juice and lemon zest. Add sour cream and mix well. Pour into pie crust and chill 2 hours or until set. Top with Cool Whip and keep chilled until served.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the very busy little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

WE still ask for material for the Fan each month, knowing what the results will be. Out in the shop I think the display motor from Ron's 61 4 dr is ready to install on the trailer. It runs good, looks OK, has great oil pressure, and should look good when finished. I need 2 or 3 helpers here soon to get the old leaky motor off the trailer, and clean up the trailer, then install the motor again. PLEASE?

The ham radio show season has begun, and car shows will be here before you know it. This includes our annual Recall. I found a brand new in the box quality battery maintainer very cheap at the last ham show to use on the club trailer battery.

On another subject, there was an article in the June issue of Classic Car Magazine that got a lot of guys commenting online. It was very caustic sounding at first, from some one "who was there" as a Chevy mechanic when Corvairs came along. I was there also, but only as a visitor to the shop at the Chevy dealer in Baldwinsville NY. I remember 2 guys there (including the owners son) who hated working on Corvairs. They really hated dealing with the tin work, and were ruthless at times beating things together with rubber hammers. I ended up doing a few jobs (comebacks) at home for them. Most of the work was giving them trouble because they were trying to cut corners, or not cleaning parts. The Magazine article referenced Valve jobs at 45,000 miles etc. 60 and early 61 had small valve springs with not enough seat pressure for abuse. Mechanics would have the timing too far advanced, raising temps and burning valves. Mid 61 they put better valve seats, better valve materials, bigger, better valve springs, and better distributors. They also changed how the thermostats on the lower shrouds worked, and went to automatic chokes. Along the way, they made changes to the chambers in the heads, changed cam curves, and many other subtle upgrades. Tech bulletins came to dealers often with suggested mods to rectify problems showing up at dealers. There were no "cob job fixes " authorized , such as beer can repairs etc. The right way was to fix it right as possible the first time using correct methods and parts. Not much has changed over the years, there are still "why me?" guys working at all sorts of jobs that should try another profession. So, in reality this poor guy was fairly accurate on some of the problems, mostly with the first year and a half of production, but you can almost feel the negative feelings he had reading that article. The other inaccurate comment was about removing the radio. It was not that hard to do, and did not require "removing the whole dash". The water leaks were addressed with a few bulletins, touching up body seam sealer, or cleaning leaves out of drains under the edge of the fenders. Body panel fit, including doors and lids were no worse than any other GM car including Cadillac, in fact maybe better because of unibody construction.. Please note : ALL of my comments are from memory, and should be close. I just had to say something in slight defense. You can buy copies of the original service bulletins from Clarks and read up on it. Actually, you might solve some issues on your own car you thought were impossible by reading Corvair literature, including the CORSA tech guide, which includes most of the bulletins . . I will include a scan of the Hemmings Classic Car article when I send this Via Email.

I am back working on the Cord project, now that the club motor is finished. I also need to do some work on the Rampy soon. I have all new super bright L E D bulb replacements to install in the dash units in all 3 vehicles. Getting tired of laying under the dash to repair and install things! It is hard on my back.

After this upcoming rain storm to wash the salt away, I will be driving it again.

This month I have a newly rebuilt FC motor for sale. It is run ready to install. New .060 cylinder setup, heads done, new cam (304) and <u>many</u> other extras. The carbs are rebuilt, alternator is Hi output, and much more It is very clean and detailed. ASK me for details and price. It has been run and tuned in for @ 2 hours or more on the test bench.. It is ready to install and drive. It is set up for automatic transmission, including a good converter.

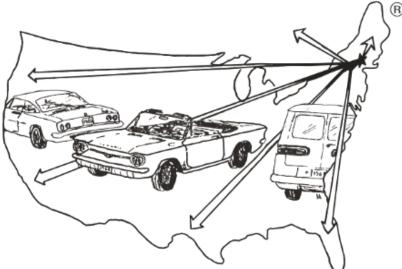
