We ventured to the "big city" of Gainesville on August 25 to attend a show sponsored by City Electric Supply to benefit a group called "Children's White Christmas". We joined 46 other entries in their parking lot to show off our rides. It was a great day for a car show - the temperatures were in the low 80s with a breeze and many shady spots to sit. The vehicles were the usual mix of old and new, including the usual Camaros, Mustangs, Tri-5 Chevies, 30s and 40s Fords, hot rods, and a few late model factory hot rods mixed in. Spinach Dip Pinwheels

1 ½ (17.3 oz) pkg puff pastry, thawed
1 (16 oz) container prepared spinach and artichoke dip
¾ c shredded parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 400° . Line baking sheets with parchment paper. Unfold one sheet of puff pastry. Top with 1/3 of spinach dip. Top dip with 1/4 c parmesan.

Starting at long end, roll up jelly roll style. Cut into 16 pieces.

Place pieces on baking sheets. Repeat with remaining 2 sheets.

Bake for 15 to 18 mins, until golden brown.

Philly Cheesecake Stuffed Peppers

1 lb thinly sliced roast beef

8 slices provolone cheese

4 lrg green bell peppers

1 small sweet onion

6 oz baby white mushrooms

2 Tbl butter

1 Tbl olive oil

1 Tbl minced onion

salt and pepper to taste

Slice peppers in half lengthwise, remove seeds. Slice onions and mushrooms and sauté with butter, olive oil, garlic and salt & pepper until soft. Preheat oven to 400°. Slice roast beef into strips and add to mushroom mixture; cook about 5 ns.

We have so many activities each month, a year goes by very quickly. September was no exception. Between ham radio and car things we kept very busy, and toss in keeping up with the lawn and getting ready for winter...We have our season stock of wood pellets put away now. We enjoyed the day at Jordan Fall festival. We also had a display of what can happen if we all do not arrive early and together. We sent one person away from a spot we were trying to save in an ugly mood. Other than that we enjoyed seeing all the cars and people, and eating some great food. We had a very good showing of Corvairs there. We just got home from 5 days of touring VT, Rita and I have been there with the group every year since it started in 1979. So the impossible combination of 95 heads, 260 cam, .060 cylinders / pistons, with a powerglide is perfect in the Rampside. It cruises at Thruway speeds just fine, has good pickup etc. My plans are now to put the same heads on the Lakewood if I get time soon.
