Kitchen Corner

Orzo with Peppers & Spinach

1 c orzo, cooked, drained

1 Tbl olive oil

1 med sweet orange pepper, chopped

1 med sweet red pepper, chopped

1 med sweet yellow pepper, chopped

1 c sliced fresh mushrooms

3 cloves garlic, minced

½ tsp Italian seasoning

¼ tsp salt

½ tsp pepper

2 c fresh baby spinach

½ c grated parmesan cheese

In large skillet, sauté peppers and mushrooms in olive oil. Add garlic and seasonings; cook & stir 1 min. Stir in spinach until wilted. Stir in orzo and cheese & heat through.

Turkey Divan

3 c cooked turkey

1 bunch broccoli, cooked

1 (8oz) pkg sliced fresh mushrooms

1/4 c finely chopped onions

1 can cream of chicken soup

½ c milk

½ c parmesan cheese

Put broccoli and turkey in casserole dish. Mix remaining ingredients except the cheese and pour over the casserole. Sprinkle with parmesan. Cover and bake at 350° for 30 to 40 mins.

Lemon Cheesecake Crescent Roll Ups

1 (8oz) pkg cream cheese, softened

½ c sugar

4 tsp grated lemon peel

1 (8oz) can refrigerated crescent rolls

1 Tbl butter, melted

Glaze:

½ c confectioners sugar

2 to 3 Tbl lemon juice

Preheat oven to 375°. Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper. Mix cream cheese, sugar lemon peel until well mixed and no lumps remain.
Unroll dough and separate into 8 triangles. Spread 2 Tbl filling over each. Roll up each triangle starting with shortest side and pinch seam to seal. Place on cookie sheet, seam side down; brush with melted butter. Bake 11 to 14 mins or until golden. Cool 10 mins. Mix confectioners sugar and lemon juice. Drizzle over warm crescent roll ups. Serve warm.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the very busy little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

Here we are again, still working out in the shop most of the time. At least now I am working on Corvairs. I have a turbo coupe with a larger than planned "punch list" apart now. I am also finally working on the Rampy. The weather gods let me shuffle cars around @2 weeks ago, so my truck is up on jack stands with no powertrain in it in the corner. The Cord is waiting to be picked up. The truck motor was running great, but using a lot of oil since it got super overheated on a trip. I am also cleaning up some of the damage caused by a large (@15 gallons) waste oil spill in the back. I only found one ring damaged and frozen in a groove. I replaced all. The full fin cylinders looked fine, so just a fast scuffing and washing was all they needed. The motor is almost all back together, but cleaning and repainting shrouds etc takes time. I also have a rebuilt rare late FC powerglide and 3:27 differential to try in it. Looks like the oil wrecked my special hand made wire harness also, so I will rebuild that. Cleaning the oil film from the engine compartment is a huge challenge for me. Several attempts to clean it at car washes and my own power washer with Dawn injected have helped, but it still is grungy. I also plan on changing the steering gear to a very low mileage one. I have to modify the shaft a little to fit the car wood wheel, and late car type signal light switch. I hope to clean up as much as I can, but the 25 plus year old paint job is starting to show its age in spots. Another improvement I made was to the lighting. It now has very bright L E D s front and back. Then I found some very bright L E Ds that replace the dim dash lights. Amazing how much better the gauges are lit up now. I am looking into some newly available L E D bulb replacements for 1157 and 1156 bulbs for the Lakewood and coupe. They will be here soon. I can't wait to try them. Dim lights are a real problem on most older cars. My next attack will be the head lights. I have some German light bulbs to replace the originals, but I had to make modifications to the bucket assemblies to make them fit. In order to put them on the cars, I have to make the "cups" deeper, and water tight. On the truck it will be ok opened up. I will also run the headlights thru a relay with a heavy power wire from the battery. This will also let me set them up to run only with the ignition key on.. Another problem I want to fix is all the extra wiring for all of my "options" needs to be neatened up.

Some time this winter I hope to do a lot of work on the club display trailer. The motor needs one lifter replaced, it just will not break in , it calms down after running a long time, but is always noisy when started up. I plan on changing it . Then, since I have several here, I may change the trans axle to a late model powerglide. That way I can have it operational without worry about axle flanges falling out. (lates bolt in to the carrier assembly) So I want to add a dash with shift lever, tach, speedo, and a throttle lever. I think this would be a nice display at car shows.

I have been hearing from some new members that do not live close by. Some have interesting projects going on. I have some pictures from new member Everett Cook in Chazy NY (way up northeast) of his Greebrier project. He also has other Corvairs. I also selected a few pictures from some of last years shows for this months picture page.




