#### STEVE LACKEY'S RESTORATION PROJECT

#### \_Restoration of 1965 Corsa--(Part 2):

Last month I wrote about a 1965 convertible I acquired from Jim Garafalo, stored in my barn for many years and started to restore in 2017.

Although I thought the body was rust free, there appeared to be a lot of surface rust from storing it for 30 years. Look at the first two pictures. After I had removed every part that could be un-bolted, I started scraping and wire brushing. This went no where, I couldn't get into the tight corners, and the brush just didn't remove everything. The car still looked pretty corroded underneath. Maybe I could get the underneath side sand-blasted. I asked around and talked to a couple of shops that did that work and decided on the "Sterling Stripper" in Bernhards Bay. Mike Sterling is the owner and he is into 1960's Camaro's. I was impressed with Mike's easy going attitude and down-to-earth style. He seems like a nice guy. I recommend him to anyone that wants something sand blasted. They will mount the body on a rotisserie so they can rotate the car 90 degrees to gain access to the underside. He visited my garage and said he had just finished sand-blasting an early Falcon, it turned out well and the price was around \$2000. Mike picked up the 65 convertible with his trailer and took it to Bernhards Bay. Two days later I get a call from Mike, not only did the rust blast away, but the remaining underside sheet metal was so thin that it blasted away too. My rust free body is disappearing. Mike says he will keep working on it if I want, but I will have far more tied up in the car than it will be worth. I've waited 30 years to get to this point and worked around that car stored in my barn. This was one of projects I had planned on completing in my retirement. The floor boards will all need replacing along with portions of the door skins. Who knows what else we will find (and find it we did). What project will I undertake to keep active (I only have 5 or 6 other major projects.) I will not be deterred, I told Mike full steam ahead. Refer to the pictures of the car on the rotisserie and after new floor panels have been welded in.

#### Kitchen Corner

#### Chicken Asparagus & Mushroom Skillet

3 Tbl butter
2 Tbl olive oil
½ tsp dried parsley
½ tsp dried basil
1/8 tsp dried oregano
1 ½ cloves garlic, minced
¼ tsp salt
1 ½ tsp lemon juice

2 skinless boneless chicken halves, sliced

½ lb fresh asparagus, trimmed and cut in thirds

1 c sliced fresh mushrooms

Melt butter and olive oil in skillet. Stir in all the seasonings and lemon juice. Add the chicken; cook until chicken is browned. Reduce heat to medium and cook until chicken is no longer pink inside. Add the asparagus and stir until the asparagus is bright green and just tender. Stir in the mushrooms and cook an additional 3 mins.

#### Carrot Pineapple Salad

3 lrg carrots, grated
1 stalk celery, finely chopped
1 (8 oz) can crushed pineapple, well drained
½ c golden raisins
½ c mayonnaise
Combine all ingredients, cover and chill before

1 c flour ½ c nuts

Cream together and spread over the crust

2<sup>nd</sup> layer ----

2 c well drained crushed pineapple

4 or 5 sliced bananas

3<sup>rd</sup> layer ----

12 oz cool whip

chopped nuts on top of cool whip

1 can cherry pie filling

Hershey's syrup drizzled over top

Refrigerate 24 hours before serving

#### TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the very busy little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

Same routine, working on the 64 Spyder coupe. It is coming along nicely. I have replaced most of the hardware on the motor that was badly corroded. I repaired the radio, and the speedometer. I also installed all LED bulbs in the dash. They are MUCH brighter. I also had to repair the signal light parts under the steering wheel. I cleaned all the contacts on the fuse block. The lesson learned on this job, is be very careful how you store your cars.

On my own project, I put my rampy motor back together again, and it still smokes on the right side. This is after a careful review of the pistons and cylinders. The teflon valve seals look like new. Maybe my next step is to replace one cylinder and piston. It is hard to believe that it smokes (oil smell smoke), after all the testing I went thru. I went thru leak down testing on all cylinders, they are all about the same. The only clue is the #3 cylinder with a pinched ring groove, and the funny pattern on the cylinder. It does not take me long to tear it down, but I could feel better about it if something obvious showed up. I am hoping to get it all fixed in time to use this season. I also hope to clean up the damage caused by spilling 15 gallons of waste synthetic oil back there. I installed the powerglide and differential I rebuilt. I have a very low mileage 64 greenbrier steering gear to install yet. My other dream is to rebuild the vent window assemblies with new rubber seals. I have had the kits for several years. This will cure the incoming water when going thru a carwash.

The white Lakewood is about ready to hit the road. I only have a couple more things to do the heater system (get the frozen cable shut off) and finish installing some interior parts. It drives well on the road.

It is good to see Steve restoring his late convertible. That should a very nice car when he gets it done. That is a lot of hard work! I included the 4 pictures of his progress. Steve was one of this clubs earliest hard working members.

I took a few pictures when I was at the Fingerlakes Machine shop last week. I thought you might like to see what a class act shop looks like. Most of the motors are for top running race cars from around the state. His shop is the cleanest busy shop you will ever see. He has a separate "clean room" for assembly of motors.. He has all the machines needed to do the best work. The only downside is he is always super busy. I have been using him for motor machine work for a while now.

I am waiting for the list of 2019 car shows to show up. I will send it around as soon as it comes in. We look forward to a few of our favorites, including the Waterloo Memorial day show, Recall, Fairhaven fourth of July show, Port Byron, Jordan Fall Festival, and a few others. The years go so fast!

We really enjoyed the new meeting place at the Phoenix OTB . The food was great, and the room worked out well. The portions were very generous , and desserts were all super. Everybody looked very happy with the food. We are looking forward to more visits there.


