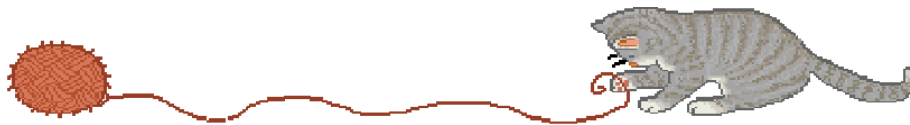

Kitchen Corner

Honey Lime Shrimp

½ lb large shrimp, peeled & deveined
¼ c olive oil
2 Tbl honey
2 –3 Tbl lime juice
zest of 1 lime
2 cloves garlic, smashed
½ tsp salt, ¼ tsp pepper
¼ tsp red pepper flakes

Combine all marinade ingredients in a zip lock bag. Add shrimp and refrigerate for 1 hr, making sure shrimp stay covered in the marinade. Heat a skillet to med high heat; add shrimp and cook till they're opaque. Serve over rice or on top of a salad. If you prefer they can be grilled on skewers.

Stuffies

1 cup chopped littleneck clams with liquid
½ c finely chopped onions
½ c finely chopped celery
¼ c finely chopped green pepper
1 Tbl butter
2 Tbl flour
1 Tbl parmesan cheese
¼ tsp salt, dash of pepper
dash of Worcestershire sauce
12 Ritz crackers, crushed
1 Tbl butter, melted
Paprika

Grind clams or chop so you have 1 c clams and liquid. Cook veggies in 4 Tbl butter until tender but not brown. Stir in flour, cheese and seasonings. Add ¼ c crushed crackers and mix well. Stir in clams with liquid and cook and stir until mixture is thick and bubbly. Divide mixture into 15 to 18 clam shells. Combine remaining crumbs and 1 Tbl melted butter and sprinkle over clams. Sprinkle lightly with paprika. Bake at 350 for 10 to 15 mins

Citrus Meringue Pie

Pastry for single crust pie

1 c sugar
5 Tbl cornstarch
½ tsp salt
1 c water
1 c orange juice
4 lrg egg yolks
½ c lemon juice
2 Tbl butter
1 tsp grated lemon zest & 1 tsp grated orange zest

Meringue: —

4 lrg egg whites
1 tsp vanilla extract
¼ tsp cream of tartar
½ c sugar

preheat oven to 450. line unricked pastry with a double thickness of foil and weigh down with pie weights, dried beans or

uncooked rice. Bake 8 to 10 mins. Remove foil and bake 5 to 8 mins longer. Reduce heat to 350. In a large saucepan mix sugar, cornstarch and salt. Whisk in water and orange juice. Cook over med heat until thickened and bubbly. Reduce heat to low and cook and stir 2 mins longer. Remove from heat. In a small bowl whisk a small amount of hot mixture into egg yolks, return all to pan, whisking constantly. Bring to gentle boil, cook 2 mins. Remove from heat. Stir in lemon juice, butter, lemon & lime zests. For meringue beat egg white with vanilla and cream of tartar until foamy. Gradually stir in sugar 1 Tbl at a time until sugar is dissolved. Continue beating until soft glossy peaks form. Put hot filling in crust and top with meringue, sealing to edge of crust. Bake 13 – 16 mins until meringue is golden. Cool.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the very busy little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

Lately it has just been a day by day attempt to get ahead in the shop. I spend most of my time with details on the 8 door van project. But I am also trying to work on the club motor. I think I have found out why it had "test" valve covers on it when I got that car from Ron's. It appears that most of the lifters will not hold adjustment. So I guess I better replace them. I have yet to redesign the dash, but vibration has taken a toll on the present setup. So I hope to figure out a neat way to put a Spyder dash on it.

The Van project moves along slow but sure. Working on latches and Window assemblies that have the strangest parts missing. I have spent a lot of time finding parts to replace E rings, special springs and links. One problem I will work on soon sounds simple but One of the side door handles has a broken screw in the area that a rubber bumper goes. Problem is compounded by the fact that it was chrome plated without removing that flush broken screw. That hardened the whole area, so no amount of punch work will center.. I may have to have the machine shop help me. I cleaned and painted the powerglide, because it looks rebuilt. I am putting the cast Clark's pan on it. Due to the fact I have a 3:27 differential in the Rumpy now, and do not like it, I am building a 3:55 for the Van. #3:27 is great in a car or Lakewood, but not that great in a FC.

We just got home from the Waterloo show, and it was another very large one. Sad thing was, NO other Corvairs there! Rumpy gets a ton of attention, and it seemed like everyone pictures of it on the way by..Phil and Martha joined us for the day. The Rumpy runs great now, no signs of smoke now. I will be dropping everything back out soon to go back to the 3:55 differential and a mod to the powerglide.

There was a discussion last week on Virtual Vairs about breaking starter noses. Of course loose flywheel rivets get blamed a lot, but on a powerglide? So I mentioned about weak battery causing it. I could not believe how hard it was to explain. So I finally said to try it with a very weak battery and see for yourself. That started the emails, so I broke down and about wrote a book explaining it. A picture of one mans "cure" is below. It is another example of masking the real problem with a "shortcut".

Cudos to Dave and Pam and helpers, for fielding all the hidden issues to running the Recall again this year. A LOT of hard work goes into this show behind the scenes.

I think Dave Shoemaker is bringing an interesting find to the Recall to sell. A 65 Convertible with a Yenko modified motor? To sell. Not sure of all the documentation, but a lot to it, so bring money, or contact Dave directly for more info. I put pictures of it on page 8

Also, I have a 64 95HP motor from Ron's stuff that looks very good. I sent the heads out to be rebuilt, and going thru it. It looks like new inside. I have a choice to make, do I make it a STD shift motor (pilot bearing in crank) or a Powreglide? Looking to sell it when done run testing it. It will be complete running when for sale with a used flywheel / pressure plate or Torque converter on it, rebuilt Carbs, Alternator etc. I run test them a couple hours on the table before I let them go. Let me know if any interest. Also I have a "Rust Buster" sandblaster cabinet on wheels here for sale cheap. Pictures on page 8. I am fighting to make some room out in the shop!

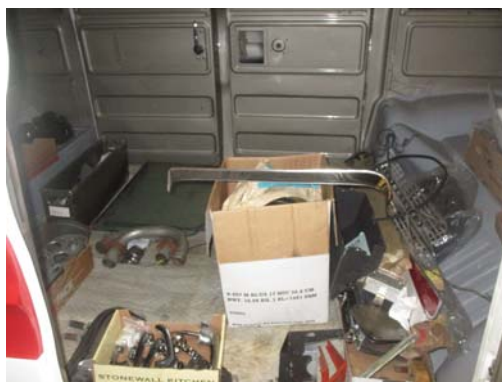

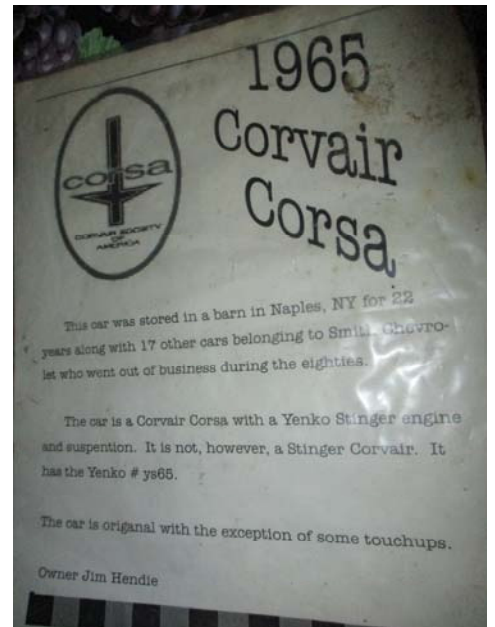

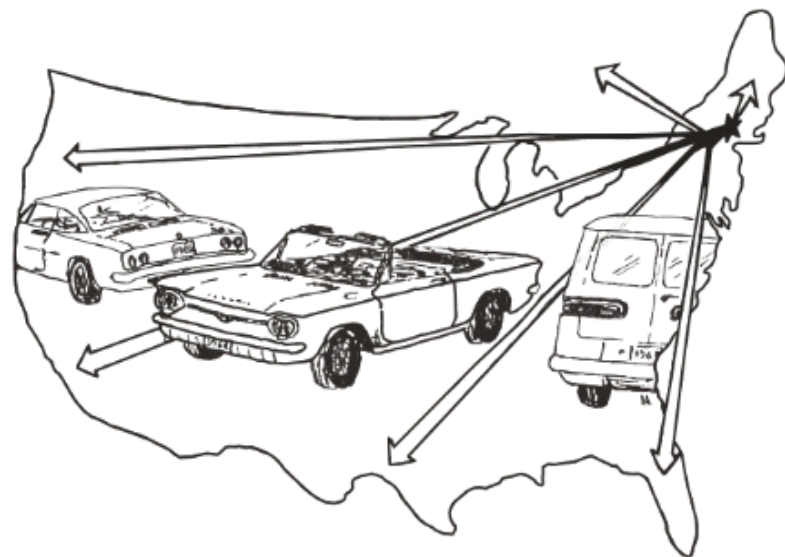
THE NEAT 65 CORSA CONVERT FOR SALE BY DAVE SHOEMAKER

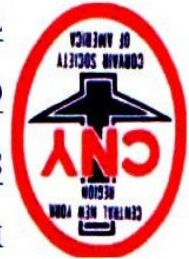
