#### Autumn Apple Nog

1 (1 oz) box sugar free vanilla pudding 2 cups unsweetened apple sauce 5 cups milk 1 tsp cinnamon ½ tsp nutmeg whipped cream (optional topping)

Whisk together and heat on low until heated through. Top with whipped cream

#### Apple Cider Pork Chops

4 center cut pork chips salt & pepper 2 Tbl veg oil

1 ½ cups apple cider

2 Tbl brown sugar

1 Tbl whole grain mustard

Pat chops with salt & pepper. Heat oil in skillet over med high heat and cook chops until golden brown. Remove from skillet. Add cider and brown sugar to pan and cook to thick syrupy glaze. Stir in mustard and season with salt & pepper. Pour glaze over chops

#### Marmalade Candied Carrots

2 lbs fresh baby carrots 2/3 c orange marmalade 3 Tbl brown sugar 2 Tbl butter ½ c chopped pecans 1 tsp rum extract

Cook carrots to just crisp tender. In small saucepan combine marmalade, brown sugar and butter; cook and stir over med heat until thickened and reduced to about ½ cup. Stir in pecans and extract. Place carrots in large bow. Add marmalade mixture an

#### Recall

Dave stated that Hilton Garden Inn will now be charging for the 2020 season for the banquet room at \$300.00, but that the normal fee for the banquet room is \$600.00 per day for that room and will be enforced for the 2021 season per day. They will also be enforcing the no outside food being brought in to the facility for the 2021 season, so we will have to purchase all food through the hotel and cannot provide the food for the hospitality room ourselves any longer through the club. Phil has checked into Vernon Downs as a possible venue with it being available in two years, at approximately \$100 a day for autocross use and approximately \$24 a plate for the buffet, he did state that he could check further pricing and more accurate pricing.

It was brought to our attention that Mike form the Phoenix OTB also would be interested in hosting our event for Recall. There are hotels just 4 miles down the road at the next exit, Phil has checked and the Best Western would give us a room rate of \$99.00 a night with a continental breakfast. We could continue and try and work out a deal with Mike if everyone would like this idea.

It was brought to everyone's attention to feel free to go out on your own and check into places that we could move the event of Recall to because it looks like it's going to have to happen.

Lew will check into a couple places in Oswego.

#### TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the very busy little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

This time of year is very busy for car people. The last few shows and cruise ins, then fall tours, then put the cars away properly. Then I have to plan what I am going to work on in the shop and arrange vehicles so I can work on them. This summer was a real fast one. I ended up changing the motor in the Rampside 2 weeks before driving it to the Baystate bi-annual show at Clark's Corvair. I took the motor from the Lakewood (060 bored, OT20 cam, etc.) put it in the Rampy, and put another nice motor in the Lakewood. The motor that was in Rampy was going thru a ton of oil, but runs great. I guess it will end up getting new pistons, not sure yet. This is the one that get VERY hot in the mountains in Massachusetts a few years ago. You know it was hot when the hot lite came on and the belt was still there!, and you could hear the oil boiling when I finally got to a place we could turn off. After changing the motors around, I was driving the Rampside on a test ride when it acted slightly off, idle changed, and vacuum gage read low (Spyder dash). So I checked and found a loose nut on the left carburetor. Well that turned out to be threads pulled out. So that night after supper I went out and fixed it. I run into stripped threads on a few things that old, and have done a few thread repairs using Helicoils. I run a shop vac hose near the work site when drilling or tapping. I then wash the hole out with solvent, blow it dry with a rag over it to keep from spraying stuff all over the clean motor. Then I put the insert in with the tool, with Loctite on the threads. Then just put things back together. Of course it was the harder to do one with the recessed hole. But it took less than an hour to do it. I use the exact same procedure for pulled studs in the bock, I have included a few pictures elsewhere. This year I seemed to keep running into setbacks, but was able to overcome most of them.

We had a very nice time at the Baystate show at Clark's Corvair in spite of a couple short showers on show day. Phil followed me with the "green" convertible, Amy followed in her "modern car" and it was an uneventful ride. I was surprised /VERY pleased at how the Rampside behaved with the 3:27 differential, maintaining good speeds on the hills we encountered. I think it may stay that wav now.

Next we had a fun time at Jordan. But we now know we have to be there very early to get our spots out back. As it was this year we arrived before 8AM and there were already vehicles in our area, so we had to move a little. It all worked out Ok, and we had the 2 tents up on the grass. One of my friends that goes there with his Rod was there at 6:30 AM and was #6 in line to get in.

Our next (almost last) event is our 40th annual VT tour. Then a fall tour later for us, but you will be going on a tour while we are gone. I sent out the info already.

I have decided to buy bare blower bearings and press hubs on myself. They are getting way too expensive assembled. I can do them here just fine. I clean the hubs before removing the old bearings, then paint them before pressing the hubs on the new bearings. I put new bearings on all the motors I build, so I need a few every year. I always use 65-69 larger bearings and fans. If you have need for any older bearing cores, I have some of the 3 early styles. I just hate to throw them away.

I was at our old repair shop the other day, and 2 Corvairs were there for work. The guys are starting to get into almost anything but major powertrain work. They do suspension work, and alignments, and most other projects that come up now.

We welcomed Michael Ward to the Corvair club and he showed us his very nice 61 Corvair 4 door. We hope to see him at more events with us. So we now have a few earl 4 door cars in the group.

I know I forgot something, but it will come to me after it is too late!

. By the way, if anyone reading this needs new vent window rubber for a late model, I have a spare set. C7644 For \$90.00 ( they list for \$123.50) plus any shipping from zip 13164.

Also in my for sale group, I have a good 70,000 btu heater like new \$50.00, late powerglide differentials \$25.00, portable sandblaster that is new harbor freight. I am trying hard to get rid of things that I do not need to free up much needed space.






