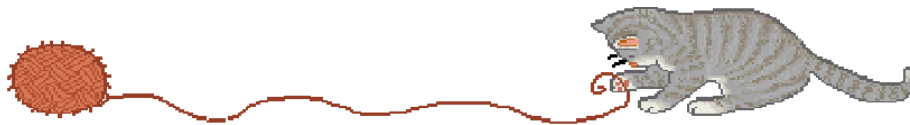

Kitchen Corner

Thanksgiving Croquettes

2 cups diced cooked turkey
2 cups mashed potatoes
2 cups stuffing
2 lrg eggs, beaten
2 Tbl water
flour
panko breadcrumbs
oil for frying

Mix turkey, potatoes and stuffing together; set aside. In 3 separate bowls place flour, eggs & breadcrumbs. Roll the turkey mixture into 2 inch balls and coat each in flour, egg and breadcrumbs. Place on baking tray so they can dry slightly. In lrg skillet place an inch of oil to fry croquettes in batches.

Alternate method is to bake in 425° oven for about 20 to 25 mins or until breadcrumbs brown.

Mashed Maple Sweet Potatoes

4 lrg sweet potatoes
½ cup softened butter
1 cup heavy cream
2 tsp vanilla
½ c brown sugar
1 tsp salt
½ c maple syrup
1 c chopped pecans
2 eggs, beaten
2 Tbl maple syrup
¼ c chopped pecans

Preheat oven to 350°. Cook sweet potatoes and mash with butter, cream, vanilla, brown sugar, salt, ½ c maple syrup, 1 c pecans and eggs. Spread mixture into a 2 qt buttered casserole dish. Sprinkle with the 2 Tbl maple syrup & ¼ c pecans. Bake 30 – 35 mins.

Gingersnap Rum Apple Crisp

¾ c brown sugar
3 Tbl flour
2 ¼ tsp ground cinnamon
1 ¼ tsp ground allspice
1 tsp salt
¼ tsp ground ginger
6 c thinly sliced peeled apples
6 caramels
1/3 c rum

TOPPING:

¾ c crushed gingersnap cookies (about 15)
¾ c brown sugar
½ c flour
½ c butter, cubed
vanilla ice cream

Preheat oven to 375° . .

Transfer to a greased 8" baking dish. For topping mix crushed cookies, brown sugar and flour. Cut in butter until crumbly. Sprinkle over filling. Bake 35 – 40 mins. Serve with ice cream.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

HELLO AGAIN from the very busy little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY.

This time of year is very busy for car people. The last few shows and cruise ins , then fall tours , then put the cars away properly. Then I have to plan what I am going to work on in the shop and arrange vehicles so I can work on them, Last weeks featured car in the shop was a quick carb rebuild / replace on Amy's Roman red 62 4 dr. Carbs turned out very good , but while she was road testing it on a slow turn (thankfully!) the right hand strut rod support on the cross member broke and let the strut rod try to enter the gas tank thru the sender. She was able to return to the shop with no further damage and I got it up in the air to take a look and pictures. So it now awaits transportation to another shop for a substitute cross member replacement and rebuild.

This weekend was the Baldwinsville Ricky Ticky Old car club fall tour. It is always a fine time . Now I suppose it is time to put the truck away. We did not drive it as much the last 2 years because we mind the heat more now , and enjoy A/C. We still got over 3000 miles on it , including the trip to the Baystate show at Clark's Corvair Parts. We had a lot of fun this year , and still may get in some more miles before storage. The latest motor is working out very well , but I wish I had put the 3:55 differential back in it instead of the 3:27 that is in it now.

The white 8 door van for Phil is still being worked on here. It will be a long job yet. I just got the plating back . Bumpers and vent window frames now shine like new. I have a ton of assembly work to do now. Headlight buckets , wire harness work to convert to a Spyder dash , convert to gas heater , along with brake work and clean up the engine area before installing the new powertrain. Up-coming eye cataract surgery will slow down shop work for a while.

I am also working on preparing to sell the Lakewood. It will be a while , but decision has been made to cut down here. After that is ready to go I hope to look into the club motor display. I have a lot of ideas and plans to improve it. Only thing I am not sure of is some sort of quick , simple cover. I may ask the boat canvass guy for help after I am done.

I still have the motor on the stand that has oil consumption problems after really getting hot. I am going to change the pistons / cylinders and try that. That has been a weird situation. Right now I have just been using it to test carbs that I am rebuilding.

I am trying to clean out some items in the shop storage area to make room for the trailer and one other car. I am close , but have a little more to go. Items such as a shop heater ,a new sandblaster media recovery unit , a new universal towbar, and miscellaneous parts must go. I hate to toss , but it may come to that.

I have a page of pictures , mostly of Amy's Roman Red 4 dr , and another page of lots of miscellaneous pictures from last summers activities. If any of you ever have pictures to share , please send them on.

Also keep your eye on the website for a bunch of new pictures coming soon.

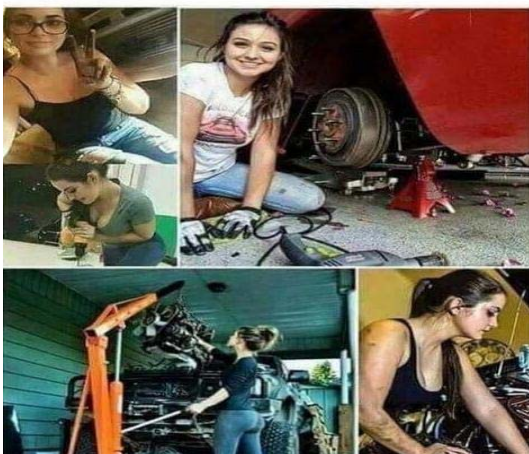

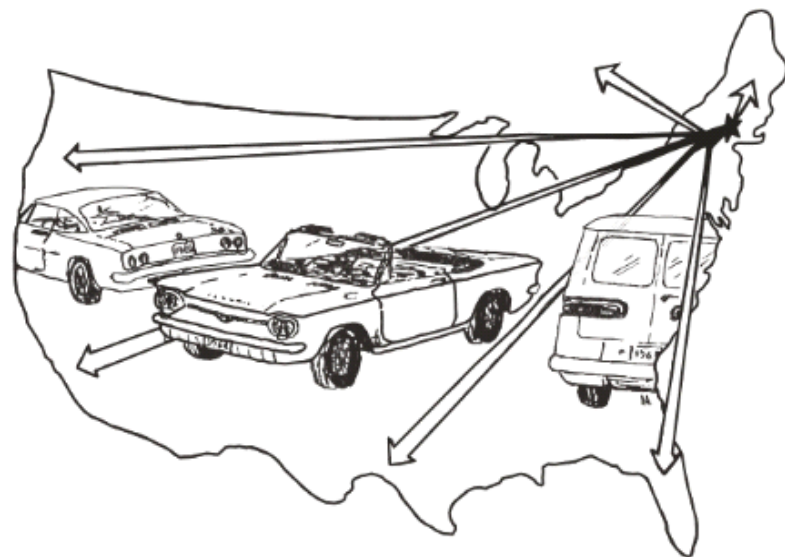

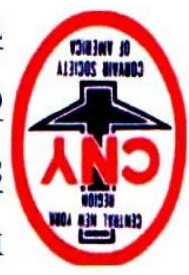
