Kitchen Corner

Balsamic Strawberry Asparagus
1 lb asparagus, ends trimmed
1 Tbl olive oil
1 C balsamic vinegar
20 strawberries, sliced
10 leaves basil, chopped
salt & pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 400° . Place asparagus on a baking sheet with olive oil. (line with foil for easier cleanup). Roast for 8-10 mins until just tender. While asparagus is cooking boil the vinegar until reduced to about $\frac{1}{4}$ c. Place asparagus on serving plate, top with strawberries, basil, salt & pepper. Drizzle with the balsamic.

Cherry Glazed Chicken
4 boneless skinless chicken breasts halves
3/4 c cherry preserves

1 tsp onion powder

2 oz Fontana cheese, thinly sliced

2 Tbl chopped pecans, toasted

Preheat oven to 375°. Place chicken in a 7 x 11 ungreased baking dish. Top with preserves, sprinkle with onion powder. Bake uncovered 18 to 22 mins. Top with cheese; bake 5 mins longer. Sprinkle with pecans. No Bake Chocolate Raspberry Cheesecake

1 chocolate graham pie crust

2 (8oz) cream cheese, softened

¾ c sugar

1/4 c whole milk

1 tsp vanilla

½ tsp salt

3/4 c heavy whipping cream

1/4 c raspberry jam

Fresh raspberries, whipped cream & chocolate hearts to garnish. Beat cream cheese until smooth & creamy. Add sugar, milk, vanilla & salt. Beat again until smooth In another bowl beat the cream until stiff peaks form. Fold about 1/3 of the

cream into the cream cheese mixture until combined; fold in the remaining cream until fully combined. Spread the mixture into the pie crust. Mix jam with 1 Tbl water & micro for about 30 secs to make liquid. Stir & cool slightly; then drop dollops of it over the cheesecake. Use a toothpick to drag the jam through to top of the cheesecake to make swirls. Refrigerate up to 1 day (covered)

I also was asked to rebuild a 63 motor and differential for a 63 coupe from Denver Colorado area that is being restored. It came from the factory as a 102 horsepower with rare 3:89 positraction differential. There are a lot of steep roads around there. We hope to change to a 3:55 differential. The motor project is coming along nicely. A lot of parts to clean and paint. The machine shop did the heads for this job in record time. Turns out the shop owner is a long time friend of the car owner.

I am still trying to come up with a better setup for the club motor display. I plan on a Spyder dash and a late differential with a working powerglide. I also want a box of some kind for the battery and a better fuel tank holder. All of this will require removing the motor from the trailer for work. I hope to get some help here when I can work it in the schedule. It would be nice to get the display back on the road again.

When the weather gets a touch warmer, I will take a day or two and change the differential in Rampy back to a 3:55. That is much better for real travels, such as the Thruway etc for getting up to speed with traffic.

I have pictures of Lew Halstead's latest paint job, the 1963 coupe below on this page. Pictures look like it turned out to be a nice car. Of course, I am always partial to early coupes. I hope to get ours back on the road soon.


