Kitchen Corner Bacon Blue Dip

4 oz blue cheese 1 (8 oz) pkg cream cheese, softened 1 Tbsp dry white wine ½ c sour cream

1 tsp minced onion

4 strips bacon. Cooked & crumbled milk to thin to dip consistency

Combine all except milk, then add enough milk To desired consistency. Serve with crackers or chips.

Scallops & Steak on Skewers

2 lbs large scallops

Seafood Marinade:

1 c olive oil

1/4 c soy sauce

1 Tbl lemon juice

1 clove garlic, minced

Marinate scallops at least 2 hours.

2 lbs boneless sirloin, cut into cubes

meat marinade:

½ c veg oil

½ c soy sauce

1/3 c bourbon

1 clove garlic, minced

1 Tbl wine vinegar

1 tsp dry mustard

Marinate beef up to 24 hours

Grill all scallops on one set of skewers and all beef on another. Grill scallops until they start to brown, basting with marinade. – about 5 mins. Grill steak to desired doneness.

Caramel Bananas in Rum

1 1/3 c brown sugar

1/4 c whipping cream

2 Tbsp butter

1/3 c rum

8 bananas

1 c chilled whipping cream

2 Tbsp brown sugar

½ c sliced almonds

Cook & stir 1 1/3 c brown sugar, ¼ c whipping cream over low heat until sugar is dissolved & mixture is smooth. Remove from heat; stir in rum. Cover and refrigerate 1 hour. Cut bananas lengthwise & crosswise into halves. Top with caramel sauce. Beat cream & 2 Tbsp brown sugar until stiff. Spoon over bananas. Top with almonds.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

Greetings from "The Little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY". .Some months I have a hard time getting inspired to get this column together. Then I get rolling and run out of space!

With all the Covid 19 Virus stuff going on , for who knows how long , everything to do with gatherings is so up in the air nobody can plan on events to add to the calendar. This could take 90 days or 90 weeks , they don't really know how to handle this mystery yet. This is all like a bad dream.

My life is mostly out in the shop, working hard on tasks to do with the 8 dr van project, I am almost ready to install the power-train. I put new transmission mounts in, and all brake tubing, I am converting it to a dual master cylinder and silicone brake fluid. I have remade the main wiring harness with extra wires and tubing to add a Spyder dash, and other items. I still have a situation with the left door handle that needs a hard to find part. The vent window parts are very hard to get together just right, but I have more tools now, and a few spare correct rivets.

The 63 coupe project is stalled waiting for new bearings for the differential. The motor runs good, and the transmission is cleaned up looking better inside and out. The body is being put back together after a complete redo.

The other powertrain for my truck is ready to reinstall after getting new Grant rings, and a 3:55 differential. This motor has the crane 270 cam in it instead of the Otto parts OT20 which is in the truck now. Not sure if I will just hang on to the extra or sell it.

We will be riding around in the Rampy again now that the last heavy dose of salt is rinsed off the roads. They were still very White last week, but rain finally washed it away.

I am starting to rebuild some of the motors I bought when Ron passed away in my "spare?" time. A lot of parts cleaning and checking involved.. The first one I did is sold and running good. It was a 64 car motor, but the guy is putting it in a wagon. A lot of the work on these motors is cleaning and redoing the shrouds with new rubber seals. I am starting on my 3rd large roll of the rubber strips. That is another hard job involving lots of time and patience.

Seeing as we have to maintain our "social distance", people will have to be creative getting together safely. Another clever idea that Corvanantics is doing, is to have a "virtual car show". Owners take currant photo of the vehicle with a front page copy of the newsletter on the windshield (to prove date of photo) and submit it via email for a "president's choice "award that was going to be used at the canceled CORSA nationals this year. I thought that was a very nice original idea.

My life has not changed much because I just keep working in the shop. But we miss going out to eat with friends. We have done a few very good takeouts, but it just is not the same. I still play a lot of ham radio, and Rita still knits and does recipes. One part of ham radio now includes sending digital pictures over the air. Guys like seeing car pictures I have taken, and shop work in process images. There are also a lot of Corvair and ham radio people all over the world. 

1963 102HP for a 63 coupe from Colorado. Also changed differential from 3:89 posi to a 3:55








