## THE PREZ SEZ .



## Kitchen Corner

### Sunshine Salad

¾ lb mixed baby greens  
 1 pint fresh , washed, hulled & sliced strawberries  
 2 oranges, peeled & sliced  
 1 ( 8oz ) bottle Italian dressing  
 ½ small onion, finely chopped  
 ½ c crumbled blue cheese

Combine greens, berries & oranges. In a small bowl combine remaining ingredients except blue cheese. Mix well and add to greens. Toss and sprinkle with blue cheese.

### Corn Dog Muffins


1 ( 8 ½ oz ) pkg cornbread mix  
 ½ c brown sugar  
 ½ c butter, melted & slightly cooled  
 2 eggs, beaten  
 1 c milk  
 ½ c shredded cheddar cheese  
 4 hot dogs, cut into small pieces  
 mustard & catsup for garnish

In a bowl combine dry corn bread mix, brown sugar, butter, eggs & milk; mix well. Fold in cheese & hot dogs. Fill greased muffin cups about ¾ full. Bake at 375 for 15 to 20 mins, until golden. Serve warm with mustard & catsup.

### Strawberry Rhubarb Pie

1 qt strawberries, washed, hulled & quartered  
 1 c sugar  
 1 ( 15 oz ) pkg refrigerated pie crusts, room temp  
 1 c cubed fresh rhubarb  
 1/3 c flour  
 1 Tbl butter, melted

Preheat to 425. Combine berries & sugar, mix well until sugar dissolves. Unfold 1 crust and put in 9" deep dish pie plate. Add rhubarb, flour & butter to strawberries. Mix well and put into pie crust. Make cut outs into top crust for decorative crust and put on top. Pinch together and trim edges to seal. Bake 30 to 35 mins. Cool slightly before serving

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

Greetings from "The Little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY". Some months I have a hard time getting inspired to get this column together. Then I get rolling and run out of space! Sorry I am slow at it, but I am very busy here wondering when I can "retire"

Seeing as we get very little or no input from members for the newsletter, I MAY not put a newsletter out every month. The decision will be made at deadline time. Like everybody else, we have other things going on, BUT I feel it is important that a newsletter be put out there each month, if nothing else to maintain our club chapter with C O R S A.

My life is mostly out in the shop, working hard on tasks to do with the 8 dr van project. Once again I have had not much input from our long lost members. This month I had a lot of interruptions in my shop work. I did finish off the motor project, now working on the differential and transmission. I also hooked up the spare Rumpy motor and ran it. I took one carb apart and replaced the viton needle with a metal one. That motor runs very good with the 270 cam and .060 oversized Cylinder/piston set up. I ran it almost 2 hours changing RPMs often. I love the sound of a motor with the cam sounds and no exhaust running on the table. I almost enjoy building these motors, best part being when I get them dialed in, timing and valve adjustment etc all adjusted.

The van project is coming along very slowly. The rebuilt headlight buckets with LED parking lights are all installed, and I am working on dash wiring and installing the gas filler pipe (pain job). I am getting anxious to have this thing run.

I would like to get the club display motor project going when one of the others leaves here. At some point I am going to need help lifting heavy objects. I want to remove the motor from the trailer and drain the oil for now to get it out of the way. Then I think the 64 Turbo motor is very rebuildable with minor expense with what I have here. It looks like everything for that motor is there. A lot of cleaning and painting and it should become an eye catcher at shows. I hope to see some interest in this project sometime this fall and Winter.

The latest excitement here not car related, is the addition of 2 energetic kittens to the household. They are brothers from a large litter. Rita found them on the Kitty corner rescue website. They are always tight together getting into trouble, sleeping, eating, and other fun things. They do enjoy a lot of intense playing. Of course we have given them lots of things to play with. So we are back in the cat life mode, feeding, cleaning the litter box etc.

Steve Lackey has been working on his late models. And the red convertible looks very nice. He drove it to lunch at Sylvan beach meeting up with some of us a few weeks ago.

I did pay a visit to the old "Show in the shade" AACA show at Clay town park. It was a very nice show with some Corvairs. I think they had 300+ cars there in a very nice setup. I will include some pictures on the photo page.
