Bacon and Egg Breakfast Tarts

Makes 4 small tarts

" Perfect selection for a brunch, but also convenient enough for serving on a weekday. Instead of Canadian bacon, try using 1/2 cup diced cooked ham or 1/2 cup crumbled cooked bacon. Place 2 tablespoons of meat into each pastry cup. "

- 1 (11 ounce) package pie crust mix
- 1 (6 ounce) package Canadian-style bacon
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
- 4 eggs
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

Directions

- 1Preheat oven to 425 degrees F (220 degrees C).
- 2Prepare pastry for a one crust pie as directed on package. Divide pastry into 4 equal parts. Roll each part into a 6 inch circle on a well floured, cloth covered board with a floured, cloth covered rolling pin. Fit pastry over backs of large muffin cups (3 x 1 1/2 inch), or 6 ounce custard cups; make pleats so pastry will fit closely. If using individual pie pans or tart pans, cut circles 1 inch larger than inverted pans, and fit into pans. Prick surface. Place tarts on an ungreased cookie sheet.
- 3Bake until light brown, about 8 to 10 minutes. Cool 5 minutes, and carefully remove from cups. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- 4Place 2 bacon slices in the bottom of each pastry cup. Sprinkle cheese over the meat, making slight well in centers. Break 1 egg into each. Add 1 tablespoon milk into each tart. Sprinkle with nutmeg and pepper. Place tarts on an ungreased cookie sheet
- 5Bake until eggs are soft cooked, about 15 to 20 min

My 64 A/C coupe will be for sale soon. Long story. I bought this car in @2006. It is a former Texas car, so no rust issues. I built the motor from a low mileage 65 A/C motor. It includes .060 full fin cylinders, Otto cam, the good electronic ignition I rebuilt the transmission and differential. I bought a lot of new parts, carpets, door panels, all cardboards. There are a LOT of new parts included. Most issues are paint and body. We drove the car for @ 2 years until I built the replacement motor when the one in the car dropped a valve seat because of incorrect work on shrouds. Windshield has a wiper burn, so a replacement glass and gasket are included. It has HANDS wheels with low mileage tires. It has a new padded dash.. You must look at it to understand the value of this package. \$8500 green cash


