Kitchen Corner

Cheesy Bread

1 c mayonnaise

1/2 c butter, softened

1 c shredded cheddar cheese

1/4 c grated parmesan

1 clove garlic, minced

3 green onions, chopped

1 loaf French bread

Combine all but the brad. Slice bread horizontally and spread mixture on both halves. Bake, uncovered, at 375° until golden about 10 to 15 mins. Slice to serve.

Turkey Spinach Lasagna

9 lasagna noodles, cooked and set aside

1 lb bacon

2 lbs ground turkey

1932 oz) spaghetti sauce

1 (16 oz) pkg frozen spinach, thawed & drained

2 (15 oz) containers ricotta cheese

2 c finely shredded mozzarella cheese

1 1/2 c parmesan

Cook bacon until crisp, Drain and reserve 2 Tbl drippings. In same skillet brown turkey, drain. Add sauce and warm through. Mix spinach & ricotta; set aside. Spread small amount of turkey mixture in bottom of greased 9 X 13 pan. Layer 3 lasagna noodles, then half of remaining turkey mixture and half the cheeses. Top with 3 noodles; spoon spinach mixture over top. Sprinkle with bacon. Top with remaining noodles, remaining turkey mixture and remaining cheeses. Bake uncovered at 350° for 30 to 40 mins. Cool 15 mins before cutting.

Frozen Peanut Butter Squares

3 c finely crushed oreos (about 30)

6 Tbl butter, melted

2 1/2 c heavy cream

1 (14 oz) can sweetened condensed milk

1 c peanut butter

1 (3.29 oz) king sized Snickers candy bar, coarsely chopped

Combine cookie crumbs & butter; mix well. Press in bottom of 9 X 13 pan. Using mixer beat heavy cream until stiff peaks form. Add condensed milk and peanut butter and beat until thoroughly mixed. Spoon peanut butter mixture evenly into cookie crust. Sprinkle chopped candy on top, cover, and freeze 4 hours or overnight.

TIM'S TECH TIME AND RAMBLIN'S

Greetings from "The Little Corvair Shop in Memphis NY". .Some months I have a hard time getting inspired to get this column together. Then I get rolling and run out of space!

With all the Covid 19 Virus stuff going on , for who knows how long , everything to do with gatherings is so up in the air nobody can plan on events to add to the calendar. This could take 90 days or 90 YEARS , they don't really know how to handle this mystery yet. This is all like a bad dream. There is too much unknown involved , and overanxious people will just make it last longer. At least I have the busy shop and my ham radio to keep me occupied. We only got in a few "day trips" in the rampy , now cutting them down to half daytrips so we do not have to stop anywhere to eat or..

The Rampy is running good. With this combination of motor and differential, but I miss the added Pep of the 3:55 differential at times. It would be perfect in a car with the 13 inch tires and lighter weight.

I have another project here for this winter. It is like the one I did last year, only this one is for a 62 Lakewood. This motor will be a 164cu inch, with 270 cam, 060 oversize full fin cylinder assemblies. I will also be rebuilding the powerglide and the differential. The wagon has a nicely done A/C system with a mix of factory and aftermarket parts. They had to get creative to make it all work.

I am still working on the 8 door van project, which is no fun at times. There are so many little details that crop up, it goes slow. It will be nice when finished (and rare!).

Another project waiting is the club display motor for the trailer. This one will be an eye catcher. It is a 64 turbo motor donated by Rick Gaffney from Georgia. It will need a ton of clean up and repair, but I think almost everything needed is there. I also plan on a Spyder dash mounted better than the last setup. So I am not bored here. Add to that my major project of moving my radio room / office upstairs into a bedroom, including wiring, antennas and computers (3 needed) it adds up to a major job. It is mostly useable now, but a LOT of work has to be done before I can fully use it for all of my radio programs.

The only other thing local that I heard about has been Amy buying a very nice 62 Olds Cutlass 2 door. It is a rare like new car found down near New York City. Her nice 62 Corvair 4 door is for sale. She still wants a Corvair again, maybe an FC even. Both of her cars are now put away for winter.

If at all possible, I need to paint our 64 A/C coupe. I also have a punch list of items to do to the Rampy. My body does not like working like this all the time. Things get heavier for me to move each year. Like I always say, cleaning and detailing parts takes a lot of my time.

Once again I have had not much input from our long lost members. I hope we can keep the club together during all this setback. If you are able to do the computer program / app called "Zoom.us" please let me know. If not , please look into it , it might be a way to see each other once in a while. All of the radio clubs now use it for monthly meetings over the computers (or even cell phones) and we enjoy it. We could organize a time to get together on Zoom once a month. There is a charge for the full version , but free works for 40 minutes now. If enough people got it working , we could talk the club into underwriting the cost (not that much). You need a webcam and microphone to use it. I suggest everyone looking into it , it will have other uses now also. The annual C O R S A meeting this years was a "Zoom" meeting well attended by @70 people.

Also PLEASE send pictures to the club website when you can. Let the rest of the Corvair world know what's going on here. You must be doing something to or with your vehicles?











