The Recall banquet will held at Jakes Grub and Grog.

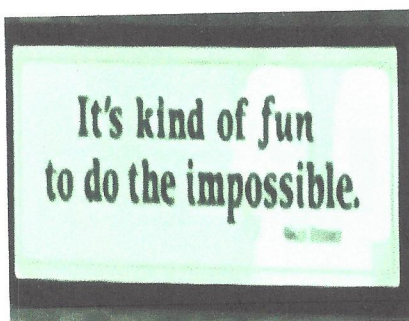
Valve cover races have been added Saturday events to fill the gap between the car show and the banquet.

Kitchen Corner By Rita, KC2GFT

Caramel Apple Pork Chops

2 tsp oil
4 boneless pork chops
2 Tbl brown sugar
1/8 tsp cinnamon
1/8 tsp nutmeg
salt & pepper to taste
2 Tbl butter
2 granny smith apples, cored, peeled & sliced
garnish; 3 Tbl chopped pecans
Heat oil in skillet over med high heat. Cook chops for 5 to 6 mins on each side until browned and fully cooked. Remove to platter and keep warm. Combine brown sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, salt & pepper. Add butter to skillet; stir in apples and brown sugar mixture. Cover & cook for 3 to 4 mins until apples are tender. Remove apples to serving platter. Continue cooking mixture uncovered until sauce thickens slightly. Spoon over apples and chops. Garnish with pecans.

Honey Glazed Carrots

1 lb carrots, peeled & cut into 1 inch pieces –
or 1 lb baby carrots
2 Tbl butter, melted
2 Tbl honey
salt & pepper to taste
Spray a slow cooker with veg spray. Add carrots
Drizzle with butter and honey. Season with salt & pepper.
Cover and cook on high for 2 ½ to 3 hours until tender and glazed.

Cranberry Cheesecake Fluff Salad

2 c fresh cranberries
1 c sugar
2/3 c pecans, chopped
1 c crushed pineapple, drained well
8 oz cream cheese
2 c heavy cream
2 c mini marshmallows
Put cranberries in food processor and chop. Add ½ c of sugar and mix well. Cover and leave in fridge for 1 hour or overnight. Remove from fridge, add pineapple and pecans and stir. Combine cream cheese with ½ c sugar and beat until creamy. Add heavy cream and mix until well combined and firm. Fold in cranberries and mix well. Gently mix mini marshmallows in. Cover and put in fridge 3 to 4 hours

NOTE: Rita was also a licensed amateur radio operator and was very proud of her achievement getting the General Class ticket (next to top level!).

Thinking way back to almost the beginning days of our Central NY Corvair Club beginnings, we had some VERY enthusiastic active members who banded together and worked very hard to make this a fun, informational, active group to be a part of. They worked very hard at it. Always full of energy doing things to promote the Corvair, having fun doing it. I remember several of those people. We joined because I had loved the 64 Corvair. MY first new car was a 64 Palomar red coupe 110hp 4 spd with 3:27 differential. for \$2896.10! . Rita bought a new White with turquoise interior 64 500 coupe base model, 95 hp 3 spd for \$1650.00. We had fun at times, her chasing me around with it. The club founders were Bob Waters, Ed Zintek, Steve Lackey, Jim Garafolo, Ron Fausak, and Jim Eamer along with a handful of others. The ONLY very early founder that I can think of that is still with us is Steve Lackey. The club had post cards with how to join us to put under windshield wipers of any Corvairs they encountered anywhere. Bob and family owned two very successful busy businesses that underwrote a lot of club costs until we all pulled together and earned our way to what looks like a lot of money now. WE also had a lot of help from other business members that are still with us. We worked VERY hard to earn that money to get to where we are now. It feels good to now see new faces joining us and hope they feel the same way. A lot of us are not feeling up to much these days and hope the torch stays lit a long time to come. Our membership reached over 244 at one point. I was member #43. Somewhere I have a box of old original papers. Some of our old original incorporation papers got lost or thrown away when a member passed away. This brings up the need for a safe place for Club documents. Our new replacement seal and papers are on file at our club attorneys office now. There are lots of other old history of the club documents elsewhere, so the board should deal with this situation as soon as possible.

I need to find a better way (software) to do this newsletter. ANY input welcome.

Looks like the 2025 Recall planning group is doing well. It is good to see this Heirloom show carry on. I have many memories going back to its start when Bob Waters came back from his first C O R S A Convention in Chicago with a dream of having a regional Corvair show here in Syracuse. The first several Recalls were very large shows at the Marriott at Carrier circle with lots of attendees and Corvair vendors. We had good support from the Syracuse Chamber of Commerce at every show. Then we had the 1982 National here. I think Rita and I attended @25 conventions and more minis. We got to see a lot of the US by attending CORSA conventions. We took the proposal presentation done by the Syracuse chamber of commerce to Denver in 1981. I had to rush to the board meeting just after getting off the airplane. Another convention we worked at was the Lake Placid convention with the Vermont Independent Corvair Enthusiasts (V.I.C.E.), which was a huge success. Kathy and Bill Cotrofeld and our cozy group masterminded this one with the help of the Lake Placid Chamber. The whole town supported us. A lot of interesting stories came from putting that one on!

I hope I can keep this newsletter going. So far no offers to take it over. So that means you are stuck with what ever I provide...

Recall convention to attract Corvair lovers

Corvair owners and enthusiasts from all over the Northeast will gather in Syracuse for a mini-convention, the 1980 Recall, at the Marriott Inn on Carrier Circle.

The third annual Recall, Friday through Monday, will attract more than 50 Corvair owners who will show and race their cars in competitions, exchange parts for their cherished autos, and swap stories about different models.

The Recall is sponsored by about 60 members of the Central New York Corvair Club, but many events in the three-day gathering are open to the public at no cost, said David Peebles, 1980 Recall chairman.

Friday's highlight will be a tour at 1:30 p.m. of the General Motors Fisher Body plant in DeWitt.

Saturday will be consumed with activity for the Corvair owners and admirers. There will be a flea market in the Marriott parking lot from 9 a.m. to sunset, and Corvair owners will be able to order parts from two vendors who will be on site.

The concours, a competition for quality, will be from noon to 3 p.m. in the rear parking lot of the Marriott. Trophies will be awarded in early and late model classes, including stock, altered, specialty and custom, and trucks and vans. Trophies also will be given to those entries judged Best in Show and for the "People's Choice" selected by spectators at the concours.

The concours last year had 22 top flight Corvairs vying for 16 trophies, and organizers are hopeful there will be more and better entries this year.

The annual Saturday night banquet will feature guest speaker Chas. Condit, a retired engineer from the local Franklin Automobile Co. and one of the foremost experts on American six-cylinder engines.

In addition to these events, there will be a Gymkhana at 9:30 p.m. in the front parking lot of the Marriott. This event, which involves driving skills in a subtly laid out course of pylons, will be supplemented by a parking lot demonstration by a local radio controlled model car club.

On Sunday, members of the CNYCOC will travel by motorcade to the state fairgrounds to view or participate in both the Antique Car Show and the Central New York Chapter of the Sports Car Club of America's Autocross, featuring used events by three classes of Corvair.

The Onondaga Lake Region Antique Auto Show will also sponsor a large flea market Sunday on the fairgrounds.
